
OPENED FOR SWIMMING - Memorial Day weekend, May 27.

OUR HEALTHCARE NON-SYSTEM

Whenever I hear the phrase "Healthcare System" I always counter that we do not have a "system" for medical care in America. The word "system" implies a coordinated network that works together to achieve a unified goal, and we have no such thing. Our medical care industry is made up of diverse entities (doctors, hospitals, clinics) that provide care of various sorts and other entities that pay for that care (insurance companies) and gatekeep what care will be provided. There is little to no coordination between any of the entities.

A major problem with Healthcare is that it is often centered on payment and that payment usually comes from a Health Insurance Company. Insurance companies are designed to pay for as little as possible while meeting whatever minimums the State insurance laws require of them. The providers of health care will often defer to the payor (the Insurance company) when determining what care to give and for how long. You can offer to pay for care, but many providers may not even know how to deal with that offer.

Another major problem is dealing with the various providers. There are specialists that only provide certain types of care (Cancer centers, Urologists, Podiatrists) and there are nursing facilities that provide care when a person needs constant direct care, but they don't always have those special medical providers available to their residents. When someone is in a nursing facility, sometimes they need to leave to get medical services from other providers and there is no easy system to get them there. It usually involves the assistance of a family member, but might require paying for medical transportation (that usually isn't covered by health insurance).

If a person is in an Assisted Living Community, it is just like they are in their own home. There is no direct medical care provided at the Community level. Whatever medical care the person needs has to be obtained by going to the providers, which requires transportation and coordination (which isn't part of our non-system at all).

If a person needs to leave home or Assisted Living and go to a nursing home, there is no system to help that take place. Most nursing homes have long waiting lists, and generally take most of their new patients directly from hospitals. The best and easiest way to move someone from home to a nursing home is via the hospital after some sort of medical incident, but you cannot plan nor coordinate that happening at the right time.

Your best solution is to have a care coordinator or care manager on hand to help you with this jumbled mess of our healthcare situation. You will have to pay for that service, but it can be well worth it to ensure that what we have works a little more like a system. Sustainable Gardening Tips

Rainwater, compost, and native plants are all excellent choices for your garden and the environment. Here is why:

Rainwater Collection - Rainwater does not contain chemicals like chlorine and fluoride, and it is free of salt and other minerals that are typically found in tap water. The pH of rainwater is usually somewhere around 5.0 – 5.5. Collecting rainwater can be as simple as placing a rain barrel at the downspout from your gutters, or if you don't have gutters, placing the barrel where the water flows off the roof. Multiple barrels can be set up and connected with piping or hoses to increase the amount of rainwater collected. These barrels typically have a spout towards the bottom that can be used to fill watering cans or to connect a hose for utilizing the rainwater in your garden.

Compost - Compost is also a great alternative to chemical fertilizers. Composting is a controlled, aerobic process that converts organic materials into a nutrient-rich soil amendment through natural decomposition. Composting can be done in your own backyard using your kitchen scraps and yard trim. If you don't have the backyard space for composting, there are three companies (Bootstrap, Black Earth and City Compost) that will collect your curbside food waste and return rich compost for your garden or You can add compost to all your gardens (veggies house plants. and flowers). Adding finished compost to your garden helps soil to retain moisture, improves the structure of the soil, attracts beneficial organisms to the soil, reduces soil erosion, and sequesters carbon in the soil.

Native Plants - Native plants are adapted to local climate and soil conditions, where they naturally occur. Native plant species provide nectar, pollen, and seeds that serve as food for native butterflies, insects, birds and other animals that have evolved with these plants. Common horticultural plants found in many garden centers do not provide proper nutrition for pollinators and other animals, and they often require insect pest control to survive. Native plants are low maintenance once established, they require less watering, they don't need any fertilizers, and they're really beautiful to look at! What should you expect from your investments?

To help achieve your financial goals, you may need to invest in the financial markets throughout your life. However, at times your investment expectations may differ from actual returns, triggering a variety of emotions. So, what are reasonable expectations to have about your investments?

Ideally, you hope that your investment portfolio will eventually help you meet your goals, both your short-term ones, such as a cross-country vacation, and the long-term ones, such as a comfortable retirement. But your expectations may be affected by several factors, including the following:

- Misunderstanding Various factors in the economy and the finan cial markets trigger different reactions in different types of investments so you should expect different results. When you own stocks, you can generally expect greater price volatility in the short term. Over time, though, the "up" and "down" years tend to average out. When you own bonds, you can expect less volatility than individual stocks, but that's not to say that bond prices never change. Generally, when interest rates rise, you can anticipate that the value of your existing, lower-paying bonds may decrease, and when rates fall, the value of your bonds may increase.
- Recency bias Investors exhibit "recency bias" when they place too much emphasis on recent events in the financial markets, expecting that those same events will happen again. But these expectations can lead to negative behavior. For example, in 2018, the Dow Jones Industrial Average fell almost 6% so investors subject to recency bias might have concluded it was best to stay out of the markets for a while. But the Dow jumped more than 22% the very next year. Of course, the reverse can also be true: In 2021, the Dow rose almost 19%, so investors who might have been susceptible to recency bias may have thought they were in for more big gains right away but in 2022, the Dow fell almost 9%. Here's the bottom line: Recency bias may cloud your expectations about your investments' performance and it's essentially impossible to predict accurately what will happen to the financial markets in any given year.
- Anchoring Another type of investment behavior is known as "anchoring" an excessive reliance on your original conviction in an investment. So, for instance, if you bought stock in a company you thought had great prospects, you might want to keep your shares year after year, even after evidence emerges that the company has real risks for example, poor management, or its products could become outdated, or it could be part of an industry that's in decline. But if you stick with your initial belief that the company will inevitably do well, and you're not open to new sources of information about this investment, your expectations may never be met.

In many areas of life, reality may differ from our expectations - and that can certainly be true for our investments. Being familiar with the factors that can shape your expectations can help you maintain a realistic outlook about your investments.


