

May 1, 2023 Dear Subscriber:

All subscriptions expire on June 30th of each year.

Beginning July 1, 2023, the Board of Health will be increasing the yearly subscription to \$360.00 This is an increase of an additional \$5.00 per month. The additional cost will allow us to continue to bring you the best service available at a still affordable price. This is the first increase since the beginning of our program five years ago.

To renew your subscription please see below: Beginning May 1, three renewal options are available.

You may pay on line on the town webpage <u>www.dunstable-ma</u>. gov and choose online payments. Scroll down halfway to Trash-Board of Health. New subscribers can use the same options. You may mail a \$360.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827. Please make sure your name, address, phone number and email are included. You may drop off a check or cash at the Town Hall Monday-Thursday (upper level) 9:00-4:00 p.m. Please write Joan – Trash Payment on your envelope. Please make sure your name, address, phone number and email address are included.

Overflow bags can also be purchased online or at the town hall for those times you may have extra trash that will not fit into the trash container. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of 5 for \$15.00. Bags may be picked up at the town hall Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. Bring a copy of your receipt if you paid online.

If your subscription is not paid by June 27th your last pickup will be on Thursday, June 29, 2023.

DUNSTABLE 350TH ANNIVERSARY PHOTO SCAVENGER HUNT



Hints to find some of the locations are included in the list of sites to aid in the discovery process, but your success will depend upon your observational and conversational skills. Talk to people! Photos must be taken SAFELY from roadside or public access. NO trespassing on private property is allowed. One person should be identified as the "Lead Participant" and must be included in each photo. This event is for rekindling pride in Dunstable and the fun of discovering some of its stories and "landmarks"! The list represents a total of 39 pictures!

SEARCH FOR

- The **Geodesic marker** at the Town Hall. *HINT: Step up but do not enter!*
- Five Cemeteries: The Meeting House, Central, Blood, Rideout and Swallow Cemeteries. Hint: Two are on Route 113, two are on Fletcher St. and the last one not far from the old railroad station and within sight of the site of Ellen Swallow Richard's birthplace!
- Dunstable once had five single-story **One Room Schoolhouses** before the Union School was built. Find the last two that are still standing! *Hint: One is now a brick garage but not on School St. and the other is now a yellow house at a crossroads between the French Memorial and Blanchard Hill Ski Area*

- A picture of the **town seals** of Dunstable, MA and another of the seal of Nashua, NH to see what they have in common. *HINT: Check out the logos on the sides of Nashua Police cars or DPW trucks.*
- · The garage of the Idlewild Inn
- Your choice of a picture of Woodward's Mill Pond, Austin's Pond, or Shaw's Pond
- · The view from the top of the Blanchard Hill Ski Area
- The walls at Horse Hill Quarry. (Indiana Jones would love it!)
- Jack's Bridge: Who was "Jack"?
- The **Stone Arch Bridge** ... Hint: A short walk from the low end of a high street
- The tallest cow you can see from the road.
- The Upper Dam at Lake Massapoag ... Hint: It's in Tyngsborough
- The **Lower Dam** at Lake Massapoag ... Hint: Park at Larter Field, walk back toward Groton St to the orange and blue diamond markers on a tree ... Follow them to a large opening and at the divide, take the blue diamond trail to the end
- The **Town Pound** ... *HINT: It has nothing to do with weight.*
- There was **a tavern** in the town and Dunstable's Minutemen not only met here but left from this spot to join the battle at Bunker Hill. ... *HINT: Watch out for construction!*
- A selfie with half of you in Dunstable MA and the other half in what was Dunstable NH
- The **meeting point** of Dunstable, Tyngsboro, and Groton...*Hint:* Don't get wet!!
- Find three different granite posts identifying the boundaries between Dunstable and a neighboring town ... They will have a "D" on one side and the first letter of the adjoining town on the other
- A millstone
- A picture of Calmore
- Two "outhouses" Hint: One is for boys, the other for girls!
- A barn with five silos
- Street signs of the four streets named after trees.
- A picture of you in front of the Dunstable 300th Anniversary quilt.

DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH RECYCLING NEWS

On November 1, 2022, the Mass. Department of Environmental Protection put a ban on textiles being disposed of in the trash. Textiles are described as clothing, footwear, bedding, towels, curtains, fabric, and similar products.

The Town of Dunstable Board of Health and Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation and CMRK has created a new partnership to allow residents to easily donate their clothing, textiles and small household items. CMRK has been collecting these items across Massachusetts for over 35 years. Donating is easy. Residents can schedule a free home pick up by calling CMRK 508-466-4590 or schedule online at BBBSFoundation.org.

The average person gets rid of 85 pounds of clothing a year. 95% of that clothing can be reused or recycled. CMRK 's new diversion program allows them to give clothing a second life in an easy and convenient way." Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation will pick up bagged clothing and textiles but also will accept boxed small household items such as pots, pans, small decor and more! At the new donation bins, you can drop off all bagged clothing, sneakers and textiles. CMRK also accepts non-usable clothing and textiles. Please be sure they are bagged and not wet, moldy or soiled.

Donating clothing helps the environment, helps save taxpayers money and helps clean out your closets. We look forward to forging a socially conscious and environmentally responsible partnership for years to come. Bins are located on Pleasant Street next to the Dunstable post office. Please drop off baged clothing, sneakers, etc. and textiles only. Do not leave any items, large or small, outside the bins. If you have small items, many items or large items, PLEASE CALL 508-466-4590 to arrange a pick up.

FAMILY DISPUTES

Avoiding family disputes is a goal expressed by many of my clients. It is a good goal but often difficult to meet. In some families everyone gets along and if there haven't been odd situations, then there should be little dispute after the death of the parents. But other families may be ripe for disputes with disparate treatment of children during life, or ongoing arguments between siblings. You have to prepare for what you think may happen in your family.

If your children do not get along, then you need to prepare carefully. You should make sure your Estate Planning documents are clear and unambiguous. Do not leave any room for confusion. If you wish to account for things like lifetime gifts to children, then you need to spell that out in detail in your Will or Trust. You can say something like "all lifetime gifts will be treated as an advance on an inheritance and be accounted for in the split of assets remaining at my death." Or, you can say that prior gifts are to be ignored and your assets remaining at death are to be split equally among your children. Either way, say it clearly and in writing so your children understand what you want.

No matter what you do, your children may still fight after you are gone. You may want to consider having a neutral person (a lawyer, banker, or some other professional) as your Executor or Trustee. You must prepare that person for any possible dispute and understand that they will charge for their services, which will reduce the amount going to your children. You should also prepare your children as best as possible and let them know your plans and how things are going to be settled when you are gone.

Setting expectations is the best tool. If your children know what to expect, they may not be happy about it, but they won't be surprised when it happens. Some people just don't understand how things work and what they are supposed to get. People often expect an inheritance of a certain amount, and anticipate how they will spend and enjoy it even before it comes. If they don't get what they were expecting, then they will be disappointed and may cause trouble with other family members. It is best to inform your children of how much you have in assets, how you plan to distribute them to the children, and how future events might effect the amount coming to them.



MEMORIAL DAY 2023 ~ DUNSTABLE, MA By Dr. Doug Walker – Dunstable Evangelical Congregational Church

What is the Theme that runs through our country's struggle for Life, Liberty, and the Pursuit of Happiness?

DO YOUR JOB!

Not just for the football team called the Patriots – but for all of us who love our country.

This was the point Thomas Jefferson made in "The Declaration of Independence". The mother country, England, was a fledgling democracy trying to figure out the balance between Parliament and the King that would enable them to govern and care for the people over whom they ruled. Jefferson said they were not doing their job: that we would do a better job of being a democracy on our own. So our ancestors fought and died to establish our inalienable right, granted by our creator, to pursue Life, Liberty and Happiness.

Following our victory, we set up a new system of government, called "The Articles of Confederation." But they did not work very well, so a convention was called in Philadelphia to fix them. The delegates took one look at the Articles and concluded they could not be fixed. So they set about writing our Constitution – which established a beautiful system of governance.

Patrick Henry took one look at the Constitution and concluded the delegates had not done their job. He could not support ratification without some changes. So he wrote a set of 10 amendments – the Bill of Rights – to be attached to the constitution, which was then ratified.

Now, The Bill of Rights protects the rights of the minority against the tyranny of the majority in many aspects of life – including our spiritual lives. It says two important things about the place of the church in the life of our country and our communities.

The Non-establishment clause says no church can be put in charge over people's lives. So we in the church cannot tell other people what to believe, what to think, or how to behave, no matter how much they would like to.

The free exercise clause says the government and the people cannot prevent other people from living out their faith as they see fit. So nobody gets to tell the church what to believe either.

Now god has given the church a duty to perform, saying to us, "Do your job." So according to God, and to our Constitution, what is the place of the church in its community? (You get to vote on this).

- A building in the center of town with a tall steeple where people go to get yelled by the pastor?
- A museum of ancient artifacts and traditions that a few people are struggling to keep from disappearing from the cultural landscape?
- A center of political activity used to get your candidate elected and your agenda adopted?
- A hub of self-righteous morality spewing out hatred upon everyone with whom we disagree, bullying them into complying with our narrow, bigoted views through guilt and intimidation?

None of those are correct. The job God has given us is threefold. Be His people gathered...

- 1.) To love God. Trust Him. Allow Him to guide us into the truth about life, and the best way to live.
- 2.) To love our neighbors all of you out there: to help you, encourage you, protect and defend you, in every way we can.
- To live a life of love, humility, grace, and compassion among our fellow humans.

Our thanks to you and to our founding fathers and soldiers, for giving us a place in the midst of this community.

Our thanks for being willing to forgive us when we have gotten off track; and have been harsh, boorish, ungracious, and unloving. Our thanks to you for giving us the opportunity to listen to you,

serve you, and join you in being a loving, gracious community as we live out our faith among you.

WATER SAFETY

Before going in, on or around the water, every family member should become "water smart." This starts with learning to be safe, making good choices, and learning to swim to at least achieve the skills of water competency. Everyone should be able to enter the water, get a breath, stay afloat, change position, swim a distance and then get out of the water safely. A variety of water safety courses and resources are available to help.

To help keep your family safe, the Red Cross offers these tips:

- **1.** Prevent unsupervised access to water. Fence pools and spas with adequate barriers and keep a constant eye for any water dangers such as portable splash pools/slides, buckets and bathtubs.
- 2. Adults should actively supervise children and stay within arm's reach of young children and new swimmers. Kids should follow the
- **3.** Designate a "water watcher" to keep a close eye and constant attention on children and weaker swimmers in and around the water until the next water watcher takes over.
- **4.** Always wear a properly fitted U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket when on a boat and if in a situation beyond someone's skill level.
- **5**. Swim as a pair near a lifeguard's chair everyone, including experienced swimmers, should swim with a buddy even in areas supervised by lifeguards.
- **6.** Always maintain constant attention and actively supervise children even when lifeguards are present.

Biggest threats to a comfortable retirement?

- Inflation Inflation has been high recently, but even a mild inflation rate can seriously erode your purchasing power. 

SUMMER WATER CONSERVATION TIPS

Sustainable Tyngsborough

Of the 29 billion gallons of water that is used EVERY DAY across this country, 9 billion are used mainly for landscape irrigation and, unfortunately, about half of that water is wasted due to over irrigation, run-off and evaporation. *Here are some water-wise recommendations:*

- Leave it long! Longer grass results in a more drought-resistant lawn (the longer the grass, the deeper the roots), reduced evaporation, and fewer weeds.
- Use soil amendments. Soil amendments, organic or inorganic, help the soil to retain moisture so that you do not have to irrigate as often.
- Minimize or eliminate fertilizer. Fertilizer stimulates growth, which makes your lawn thirsty. If you do fertilize, look for a product that contains "natural organic" or "slow-release" ingredients. Using these fertilizers reduces nutrient run-off into ground and surface waters, protecting natural resources, and because they feed plants slowly, they create healthier plants with strong root systems and no excessive "top growth."
- **Use a mulching mower** to cut your grass. The grass clippings left behind by a mulching mower essentially function as a slow release fertilizer, as if you were applying compost to your lawn.
- Rain barrels or cisterns can be used to harvest rainwater for irrigation and other outdoor water uses.
- Does your lawn really need water? Lawns require a total of 1" per week, including rainfall, to maintain good root systems. Overwatering causes your soil to become anaerobic. This lack of oxygen prevents roots from digging down deep and kills beneficial microbial activity. A good way to tell if your lawn needs water is to step on it. If the grass springs back it does not need water.
- Take a sprinkler break. Grass is not meant to be bright green in the summer.
- If you must water your lawn, **do your watering in the very early morning or evening**. This reduces the waste of evaporation. Sustainable Tyngsborough is a subcommittee of the Board of Selectmen. 

Walkers should know that distances may be slightly shorter as we finish the walk in front of Fenway Park. The finish line will include a celebration complete with food, music, and a speaking program. If walkers wish to participate a bit closer to home, the Jimmy Fund Walk has flexible opportunities. Participants can also join the event virtually by "walking their way" from wherever they are most comfortable—in their neighborhood, on a favorite hiking trail, or on a treadmill at home. Virtual programming and supporting materials will be available.

The 2023 Walk will be held during the Jimmy Fund's 75th anniversary year and will aim to raise \$9 million in the effort to prevent, treat, and defy cancer.
