Seniors age 70 and older have the fee waived pursuant to a town meeting vote, but the dogs must still be licensed. **Remember:** A copy of a current rabies certificate must be on file with the town Clerk.

DUNSTABLE PLANNING BOARD

At Town Meeting in May of 1995, The Town of Dunstable voted to designate certain streets as scenic roads within the meaning of "Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 15C: Scenic road designations; improvements; fines"

The law states: "After a road has been designated as a scenic road any repair, maintenance, reconstruction, or paving work done with respect thereto shall not involve or include the cutting or removal of trees, or the tearing down or destruction of stone walls, or portions thereof, except with the prior written consent of the planning board..."

Please review page 83 of the Town's General Bylaws to see if your street is considered scenic and go to the Planning Board's Forms page for the necessary Scenic Road Request form and instructions for submission. An applicant must request a Scenic Roads hearing and authorization prior to any roadside alterations on their property. DUNSTABLE HOUSING PRODUCTION PLAN: JUNE 26 PUBLIC MEETING SUMMARY AND GOALS AND VISION UPDATE

We've posted an <u>update to the town website</u> which includes a summary of the public meeting and an updated Chapter on the Goals and Vision of the HPP, based on resident feedback received at the meeting. We hope you'll have a chance to review them.

As discussed at the meeting, there are many reasons why having a HPP is important for Dunstable. Not only does it help us better understand housing need and demand, it also helps identify a vision and goals for the future in making housing more accessible. Also, if Dunstable has an approved HPP and creates a certain number of affordable units over a 12-month period, the Town will have more control over Comprehensive Permit (40B) projects for one to two years.



DUNSTABLE BOARD OF HEALTH RECYCLING NEWS

On November 1, 2022, the Mass. Department of Environmental Protection put a ban on textiles being disposed of in the trash. Textiles are described as clothing, footwear, bedding, towels, curtains, fabric, and similar products.

The Town of Dunstable Board of Health and Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation and CMRK has created a new partnership to allow residents to easily donate their clothing, textiles and small household items. CMRK has been collecting these items across Massachusetts for over 35 years. Donating is easy. Residents can schedule a free home pick up by calling CMRK 508-466-4590 or schedule online at <u>BBBSFoundation.org</u>.

The average person gets rid of 85 pounds of clothing a year. 95% of that clothing can be reused or recycled. CMRK 's new diversion program allows them to give clothing a second life in an easy and convenient way." At the new donation bins, you can drop off all bagged clothing, sneakers and textiles. CMRK also accepts nonusable clothing and textiles. Please be sure they are bagged and not wet, moldy or soiled.

Donating clothing helps the environment, helps save taxpayers money and helps clean out your closets. We look forward to forging a socially conscious and environmentally responsible partnership for years to come. *Bins are located on Pleasant Street next to the Dunstable post office.* <u>Please drop off baged clothing, sneakers, etc. and textiles only. Do not leave any items, large or small, outside the bins.</u> Big Brothers Big Sisters Foundation will pick up bagged clothing and textiles but also will accept boxed small household items such as pots, pans, small decor and more! *If you have small items, many items or large items, PLEASE CALL 508-466-4590 to arrange a pick up.*



HOME WI-FI TIPS By Dean Lotito

Most households rely on in-home Wi-Fi to connect them to the internet. A router supplied by your internet service provider generates the wireless signal used to connect to the internet. Here are a few tips that may help you maintain a goo internet connection at home.

There are two standards. They are often labeled 2.4G and 5G. Like your cell phone, the 5G network Is faster. However, for 90% of users, the 2.4G signal is more than fast enough for browsing the internet, ordering online and even streaming a movie on a single device. The important advantage of a 2.4G connection is that it is better at traveling longer distances in your house and through walls and floors. If your device is close to the router, use the 5G connection. If you are further away, you will get better performance from the 2.4G connection. If you use a lot of TVs to stream movies or a PC gamer in the house, the 5G connection should perform better. Most Wi-Fi cameras do not require a 5G signal. Since they are often outdoors, the 2.4G network is recommended.

If you have a large home, range extenders can be used to reach rooms furthest from the router. Range extenders are placed midway between the router and target device. They created a new Wi-Fi-network name that is seamlessly connected to your main Wi-Fi network. These extenders are not too expensive but can be tricky to set up properly.




