#### NOMINEE REALTY TRUST AND THE SCHEDULE OF BENEFICIARIES By Edward H. Adamsky

Nominee Realty Trusts, used primarily in Massachusetts, are a weird and misunderstood planning tool. The so-called "Trustees" hold title to property but act only at the direction of the Beneficiaries, so it is an agency agreement rather than a true Trust. Nominee Trusts were used mostly before 2003 as the law used to require that the full terms of a trust had to be recorded at the Registry of Deeds. Most people don't want their estate planning trust to be a public document, so Lawyers used the Nominee Trust which didn't reveal any private information. With the law change in 2003 trusts no longer have to be recorded so there is little need for the Nominee Trust anymore.

A major benefit of the Realty Trust was that although the Trust was recorded at the Registry of Deeds, the names of the Beneficiaries were not revealed in the Trust. They were written on a separate "Schedule of Beneficiaries" which was not recorded. The trouble is that those Schedules often got lost. If you cannot get a copy from the drafting attorney, then no one knows who the beneficiaries of the Trust are, and you have to fix that problem somehow.

If all of the relevant people agree to what the original schedule of Beneficiaries must have said, then they can create a new one. The schedules are usually signed by the Beneficiaries so if they are all together, they can create a new one. Often the beneficiaries would be the children or perhaps a Living Trust would be the beneficiary. Either way, after the original creators of the Trust have died, a new Trustee needs to be appointed (if the Trust terms don't appoint one) and the Beneficiaries have to be determined so the Trustee can be told what to do by the right people.

What if it is not clear who was supposed to be the beneficiary, or if the family disagrees? The confusion or disagreement can be solved through negotiation or mediation. If the parties cannot agree, then they may be forced to go to court and have a judge decide. It will usually be the family of the creator of the Trust who has standing to bring the matter to Court. Of course, it is cheaper and quicker to stay out of Court so it's best if the family can reach an agreement and put it on paper and then move forward with selling or transferring ownership of the property to the rightful beneficiaries.

If you or someone in your family has property held by a Nominee Realty Trust, please look for and find that Schedule of Beneficiaries, and make some extra copies of it. If you cannot find it, please go see an Estate Planning Attorney who can try to help you create a new one (if everyone agrees) or to deal with the problem if there is a dispute.

To wrap up the day's events, shortly after 7PM, we'll be captivated by a choral performance as they sing traditional Christmas carols in the church sanctuary.



We rely on electricity to keep our homes safe and comfortable, but issues arise that can put family and home in jeopardy. Flickering lights might seem like a minor problem, but it could, in fact, be a sign of a much larger issue calling for pro help. Read on for some common causes.

#### WAYS TO IMPROVE YOUR VERIZON.NET EMAIL EXPERIENCE

Many residents have Verizon as their internet service provider. If your email address ends in "Verizon.net" then you were affected by the 2017 elimination of email support by Verizon. Many of you followed instructions and started using www.mail.aol.com to access your Verizon email account. However, the AOL Web interface is not the most convenient way to access email. It is a Web portal that does not allow sharing pictures or documents from your phone directly to an email.

There is a way to improve your user experience with your email account. Your iPhone or Android phone mail app can be configured to access your Verizon email.net email. This is also true for Windows and MAC computers. It involves using the Security tab in AOL.com to create an App Password and then configuring your email App to use AOL server settings and the "App password" you created. This will allow you to keep all your emails and access them from your phone or desktop App. The www.mail.aol.com portal will continue to work too.

Your contacts can be exported out of AOL and then imported to your new email App. This is a bit more complicated but can be done. Some people converted to yahoo email addresses because of an earlier Verizon notice. Yahoo.com email addresses can also be accessed on your phone. *Feel free to contact me if you are interested in making this change.*



Start moving toward Retirement Security It's not as well-known as Halloween, but National Retirement Security week happens every October - the third week, to be precise — and while it doesn't involve ghosts and goblins, it does deal with something even more frightening: the risk of not being able to enjoy a comfortable retirement. Through various events, this occasion highlights ideas about building retirement security. What steps can you take?

#### Here are some suggestions:

• Don't underestimate your longevity. Consider this: 65-year-old men can expect to live another 20 years, while 65-year-old women can anticipate almost 22 more years, according to the Society of Actuaries. And these figures are just averages, meaning you could well exceed these ages, perhaps by many years. So, in thinking about how much money you'll need as a retiree, be aware that you could spend two, or even three, decades in retirement.

 Don't underestimate health care costs. When you retire, some of your expenses — such as transportation, wardrobe and other costs associated with your career — will drop. Others will not and may even increase. Health care is a prime example: Many people assume that Medicare or their Medicare Advantage plan will take care of virtually all their health care costs in retirement, but that's not the case. Generally speaking, you could plan on spending \$4,500 to \$6,500 per year on health care costs during retirement, excluding the large expenses connected with long-term care. Your actual costs could be higher or lower, depending on your health, prescription drugs and supplemental insurance coverage, but make sure you plan for sizable health care costs in your projected retirement budget.

· Contribute as much as you can afford to your retirement plans. Try to put in as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan and try to increase your contributions whenever your salary goes up. You may also be eligible to contribute to a traditional or Roth IRA, which offers tax benefits and a wide variety of investment options. (Contributions to a Roth IRA may be limited based on your income.)

Once you reach retirement, you can still make some moves that could help boost your financial security:

• Maintain an appropriate investment mix. When you retire, you might be tempted to shift most of your portfolio into highly conservative investments to "lock in" gains and avoid being over-exposed to market volatility that could cause short-term losses. Yet, even in retirement, you should still own some growth-oriented investments that can potentially help keep you ahead of inflation. In fact, it's important to periodically rebalance your investments back to your preferred mix to avoid taking too much or too little risk, so you may want to consult with a financial advisor.

• Identify a suitable withdrawal rate. You don't want to take out so much from your portfolio each year that you run the risk of outliving your money. So, you'll want to determine an annual withdrawal rate that can reduce this danger. A common withdrawal rate to start retirement is 4%, but your own rate should be based on several factors: your age, size of portfolio, other sources of income and so on. It can be challenging to make all the moves necessary to help achieve retirement security - but it's worth the effort. 
