TYNGSBOROUGH'S TOWN MANAGER REPORT

From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager November 2023

I am pleased to report the following information from Town over the last month. You can find a full version of the Town Manager's report online at tyngsboroughma.gov

 The FY25 Senior Tax Work Off Program will commence in January. Applications were due back to the Assessor's Office on November 2.

 Tyngsborough was awarded a \$2M MassWorks Infrastructure grant tied to public infrastructure improvements as a part of the industrial development planned for 93 Kendall Road.

• The Town's new Yard Waste Drop Off Site located on Bryant's Lane opened in October and will remain open until the 2nd Saturday in December, weather permitting. The site is open Tuesday-Friday 7:30 AM to 3:30 PM and on Saturday's from 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM. Learn more at tyngsboroughma.gov.

 Town staff are working to launch the Town's new website by February 2024. The goal of the new site is to be more user-friendly and increase transparency.

• Thank you to the Tyngsborough Fire, Police, and Health Departments for hosting another successful Health & Safety Fair at Tyngsborough Elementary School.

 MassDOT has notified the Town that is finalizing the transfer of the vacant building at 11 Indian Lane over to the Town's Affordable Housing Trust.

· Work on the Sherburne Road Open Space parcel that was donated to the Town as a part of the Toll Brother's Development began this fall with clearing, grubbing, and substantial progress made on the Club House. In the coming months, work will begin to install amenities at the site.

• The Tyngsborough Fire Department placed their new ambulance into service in October. The new ambulance will serve as A1, which is their primary ambulance. The former A1 will serve as a back up and the third ambulance will be put on the road when one of the two primaries is out of service for maintenance.



TYNGSBOROUGH'S YARD WASTE DROP-OFF SITE! There will no longer be Yard Waste Pick Ups.

The Residential Yard Waste Drop Off Site is located across the street from Town Hall, 25 Bryants Lane. The site is located off Bryant's Lane, closer to the Middlesex Road end. *This location is a town-owned parcel located directly behind (but not part of) the Bell Conservation property.* Use of this Yard Waste Drop-Off Site is available to residents only, is free and usage is unlimited during operating hours. Vehicles will enter & exit through the same driveway. Look for the signage on Bryants Lane.

Open daily Tuesday through Friday 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM Saturday 8:30 AM - 3:30 PM *The site will close the second Saturday in December (weather permitting) and will reopen on the first Tuesday in April.*

Please note that the Town will close the site during heavy rain events or snow events. Notices about changes of hours due to weather events will be posted on the Town website & social media.

Yard waste may be dumped from any type of container **or left in paper leaf bags**. No items should be left in anything other than paper bags. If transporting the yard waste via plastic bag or barrel, please dump directly onto the ground. Signs will point you to where to leave the yard waste. Your cooperation in keeping the site orderly is appreciated.

HOMESTEAD PROTECTION

If you owe someone money, with a court order, they can seize your assets to pay that debt, including your home. But Massachusetts Homestead law protects homeowners from being thrown into the street. Every homeowner gets \$125,000 of protection on their home. By filing a Homestead Declaration at the Registry of Deeds, you can increase that protection to \$500,000. In the old days the husband usually filed, now the law is gender neutral and both parties to a marriage (or other joint homeowners) can file for Homestead. There is another protection available only to a married couple and that is called "Tenancy by the Entirety." This older law protected wives from the debts of the husband. It is now gender neutral as well and protects either spouse from the debts of the other. It is recommended that every Massachusetts homeowner file a Declaration of Homestead. (Neither of these laws exist in New Hampshire by the way.)

It is rare that your home would be at risk to creditors, but it could happen. Liability for an accident and other personal financial disasters are the most likely problems. In that case you might be filing for bankruptcy protection. The \$500,000 Homestead exemption would protect your home in bankruptcy. And, even if you had equity above that limit, the creditor could only get a lien on your home and only get paid if and when you sell (or die). The law protects you from being homeless.

A recent case shows some of the limits of Homestead though. In re: Cecilia M. Hector (Mass. Bankruptcy case - 2022) the wife tried to get a gas company lien removed from her property because it was only the debt of her husband, and the house was owned as Tenants by the Entirety. The Court said that she did not owe the debt but that the lien could stay on the house and the Gas Company could get paid when the house was sold as it was a valid debt of the husband. The Tenancy by the Entirety and the prior-filed Homestead Declaration would protect from a forced sale, but not from a lien that would wait until a voluntary sale (that first \$500,000 in equity would not be subject to pay that lien though).

Another key issue is with the specific words in the Homestead Declaration. The State does provide some blank forms for your use, but you can write out a Declaration in any way as long as the right words are there. It must be signed, and the facts stated must be affirmed under the penalty of perjury (meaning you are swearing the facts are true). Some older forms, or a homemade form, might be missing that "under penalty of perjury" language so they would not be valid. In the case of Danny Luu (Mass. Bankruptcy, 2022), that homeowner lost as his declaration was missing that key language. He was still entitled to the \$125,000 automatic protection but did not get the full \$500,000 protection he might have had if his declaration form was valid.

LIVING WITH BEAVERS!

Residents Guide to Addressing Beavers and Potential Conflicts Beavers are very common and abundant throughout most of Massachusetts. By damming streams and forming shallow ponds, beavers create wetlands. These wetlands provide habitat for many diverse plants, invertebrates, and wildlife. Humans as well benefit too. Wetlands improve water quality by removing and transforming excess nutrients, trapping silt, and removing toxic chemicals, and filtering out sediment. Beavers are North America's largest native rodents. They have dark brown to reddish brown fur with large, webbed hind feet and a flat, wide leathery tail to help them move swiftly in water. Adult beavers have few predators and may live up to 20 years or more. Beavers breed during winter (January through March) and females give birth between April and June. Beavers are strict vegetarians and feed on a variety of aquatic plants and the shoots, twigs, leaves, roots, and bark of woody plants. These mammals favor habitat containing shrubs and softwood trees, flat terrain, and perennial streams that can be dammed to create ponds. Compared to other mammals, beavers are considered unique because they alter their habitat to meet their needs.

Five main options to resolving conflicts with beavers **1. Tolerance**: Humans who learn to tolerate a certain amount of beaver influence on their land generally find that co-existing with beavers provide more benefits than perceived harm. **2. Exclosures**: Fencing can provide a long-term solution, while preserving the beneficial aspects of beavers. The most effective way to protect specific trees or shrubs is to construct exclosures around them. Exclosures should be constructed of heavy-gauge fencing and be flush with the ground. Beavers are poor climbers and rarely burrow under fences, and generally do not chew fencing unless it is wrapped tightly around trees or shrubs.

The following three options require permits and/or a trapping license. Town of Tyngsborough and Tyngsborough Board of Health (BOH) have the authority to determine whether a complaint is caused by a beaver and whether the situation constitutes a threat to public health and/or safety. You can contact Tyngsborough Board of Health to apply for a 10-day Emergency Permit. Visit the Tyngsborough Conservation Commission web page for more information regarding permitting and the Commission's authority. **3. Breaching and Removing the Dam**: Dam breaching is an immediate, but short-term solution to flooding problems. If beavers remain on site during a dam breach, they will be cued by the sound of escaping water and will want to rebuild the dam ASAP.

4. Water Level Control Devices (WLCD): Sometimes referred to as "beaver pipes" or "beaver deceivers," WLCDs can regulate water at desirable levels behind dams. WLCDs require regular maintenance and may not be effective in all situations.

5. Lethal Removal: Beavers are classified as a furbearer species, for which a regulated trapping season and management program has been established. Removal of problem beavers can be a quick way to alleviate beaver problems when done by an experienced trapper. Beavers can be trapped during the open season (Nov. 1 - April 15) by a license trapper. An Emergency Permit is needed to trap beavers with restricted traps and to trap beavers outside the regulated trapping season. It is against state law to capture and release beavers into another area.


FREE CURBSIDE TEXTILE PICK UP

SUSTAINABLE TYNGSBOROUGH

Top target for reduction: Food scraps Last year, Tyngsborough had a waste characterization study done to better understand what we are all throwing in the trash. The picture below summarizes the results:



Almost half (by weight) of what is in our trash is food waste (also known as organics).

A healthy chunk of this food waste (the apple core slice) can be composted in our backyards, either buried under leaves or put in compost bins. The Board of Health has compost bins (\$35) for residents who would like to turn their scrap fruits and vegetables into rich soil.

Reducing meat, bones and dairy scraps from our waste is a bigger challenge. The drumstick slice represents meat, bones and dairy that must be commercially composted because backyard compost piles do not reach temperatures high enough to kill potential pathogens. Some residents subscribe to curbside compost collection service from approved composters (Black Earth Compost, Bootstrap Compost). At this time, the town does not have the budget to provide curbside compost collection.

The Sustainability Committee is working on solutions that will help residents reduce the food waste in their trash. If you have ideas we'd love to hear them! If you would like to start backyard composting but are unsure how, we're here to help. *Please contact us at sustainabletyngsboro@gmail.com with your ideas, questions or requests for help. Or join one of our meetings* - always the 3rd Tuesday of the month, starting at 6:30pm at Town Hall.

WAYS TO IMPROVE YOUR VERIZON.NET EMAIL EXPERIENCE

Many residents have Verizon as their internet service provider. If your email address ends in "Verizon.net" then you were affected by the 2017 elimination of email support by Verizon. Many of you followed instructions and started using www.mail.aol.com to access your Verizon email account. However, the AOL Web interface is not the most convenient way to access email. It is a Web portal that does not allow sharing pictures or documents from your phone directly to an email.

There is a way to improve your user experience with your email account. Your iPhone or Android phone mail app can be configured to access your Verizon email.net email. This is also true for Windows and MAC computers. It involves using the Security tab in AOL.com to create an App Password and then configuring your email App to use AOL server settings and the "App password" you created. This will allow you to keep all your emails and access them from your phone or desktop App. The www.mail.aol.com portal will continue to work too.

Your contacts can be exported out of AOL and then imported to your new email App. This is a bit more complicated but can be done. Some people converted to yahoo email addresses because of an earlier Verizon notice. Yahoo.com email addresses can also be accessed on your phone. *Feel free to contact me if you are interested in making this change.*



It's not as well-known as Halloween, but National Retirement Security week happens every October - the third week, to be precise — and while it doesn't involve ghosts and goblins, it does deal with something even more frightening: the risk of not being able to enjoy a comfortable retirement. Through various events, this occasion highlights ideas about building retirement security. What steps can you take?

Here are some suggestions:

• Don't underestimate your longevity. Consider this: 65-year-old men can expect to live another 20 years, while 65-year-old women can anticipate almost 22 more years, according to the Society of Actuaries. And these figures are just averages, meaning you could well exceed these ages, perhaps by many years. So, in thinking about how much money you'll need as a retiree, be aware that you could spend two, or even three, decades in retirement.

 Don't underestimate health care costs. When you retire, some of your expenses - such as transportation, wardrobe and other costs associated with your career - will drop. Others will not and may even increase. Health care is a prime example: Many people assume that Medicare or their Medicare Advantage plan will take care of virtually all their health care costs in retirement, but that's not the case. Generally speaking, you could plan on spending \$4.500 to \$6.500 per year on health care costs during retirement. excluding the large expenses connected with long-term care. Your actual costs could be higher or lower, depending on your health, prescription drugs and supplemental insurance coverage, but make sure you plan for sizable health care costs in your projected retirement budget.

· Contribute as much as you can afford to your retirement plans. Try to put in as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan and try to increase your contributions whenever your salary goes up. You may also be eligible to contribute to a traditional or Roth IRA, which offers tax benefits and a wide variety of investment options. (Contributions to a Roth IRA may be limited based on your income.)

Once you reach retirement, you can still make some moves that could help boost your financial security:

Maintain an appropriate investment mix. When you retire, you might be tempted to shift most of your portfolio into highly conservative investments to "lock in" gains and avoid being over-exposed to market volatility that could cause short-term losses. Yet, even in retirement, you should still own some growth-oriented investments that can potentially help keep you ahead of inflation. In fact, it's important to periodically rebalance your investments back to your preferred mix to avoid taking too much or too little risk, so you may want to consult with a financial advisor.

• Identify a suitable withdrawal rate. You don't want to take out so much from your portfolio each year that you run the risk of outliving your money. So, you'll want to determine an annual withdrawal rate that can reduce this danger. A common withdrawal rate to start retirement is 4%, but your own rate should be based on several factors: your age, size of portfolio, other sources of income and so on. It can be challenging to make all the moves necessary to help achieve retirement security - but it's worth the effort.
