### DECORATIVE ART SHOW TO BE HELD AT THE TYNGSBOROUGH PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Historical Society of Early American Decoration (HSEAD) in collaboration with the Tyngsborough Public Library will be mounting an Exhibit of early American decorative art at the Public Library **through October 25**. Items to be displayed will include trays, wooden and tin boxes, clock dials, and reverse painting on glass. The exhibit represents techniques of decoration that were popular in the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries, such as gold leaf decoration, bronze powder stenciling, free hand bronze and country painting.

If you don't know anything about some or any of these techniques, the show will feature one last short drop-in demonstration of selected techniques at 2 pm at the Library on October 24. So, plan to see the show and learn more about how some of these striking pieces were created.

#### SUSTAINABLE TYNGSBOROUGH

Announcing - New Yard Waste Drop-Off Site
Tyngsborough's new Yard Waste Drop-Off Site opens
Tuesday, October 10th and will be open daily, Tuesday through
Saturday, from 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM. The site will close for the
winter on the second Saturday in December (12/9) and will
re-open next year, on the first Tuesday in April (4/9). The Yard
Waste Drop-Off Site is located across the street from Town Hall, 25
Bryants Lane. This location is a town-owned parcel located directly
behind (but not part of) the Bell Conservation property.

The new contract with Republic for collecting our trash and recycling does not include curbside yard waste collection. This new Yard Waste Drop-Off Site solution replaces the twice per fall and per spring curbside collection that the town used to offer. Now residents can bring their yard waste as often as they'd like. Use of this Yard Waste Drop-Off Site is available to residents only, is free and usage is unlimited during operating hours.

**Need Help?** For residents who don't have a car or trailer capable of transporting yard waste, there are several alternatives including: Mow leaves into your lawn as fertilizer (preferred option and keeps your lawn healthy!); Compost leaves/brush on-site on your own property (space permitting); Bring smaller loads - you can come as often as you'd like; Ask a friend, family member or neighbor to borrow a vehicle or trailer; Daily trailer rentals are available at several local moving and equipment rental companies;

The Town will connect volunteers who are willing to transport leaves/brush on behalf of seniors or disabled neighbors who need assistance transporting their yard waste to the drop-off site. (this is not a yard clean-up service, only transportation from curbside to the drop-off site). 



**How Do I Manage Non-Native Invasive Plants?** 

Non-native invasive plants were first introduced to our area by humans as landscape designs, or in some cases, by accident. Because these plants did not evolve in our area, the natural mechanisms that control these species, don't exist. As a result, non-native plants can out-compete our native plants. Roughly about 72 plants have been documented by the Massachusetts Invasive Plant Advisory Group (MIPAG) as "invasive".

Since non-native invasive plants out-compete our native plants, they have cost taxpayers billions of dollars each year from lost agricultural and forest crop to impacts to natural resources and the environment. Invasive plants grow well in those less desirable conditions such as sandy soils along roadsides, shaded wooded areas, and in wetlands. In ideal conditions, they grow and spread even faster. There are many ways to remove these non-native invasive plants, but once removed, care is needed to dispose of the plant material so the plants don't grow where they are disposed.

#### **Disposal Methods**

**Burning** - Large woody branches and trunks can be burned in piles. Before burning outside, check with local Fire Department about requirements and/or permits. Any invasive plant with mature seed pods shouldn't be burned as the seeds may disperse by the hot air created by the fire.

**Bagging -** Softer-tissue plants dispose well with this method. Use a heavy black or clear plastic bag, place the plant material inside the bag, and place it in the sun for several weeks.

**Tarping and Drying -** Pile any plant material on a sheet of plastic and cover with a tarp. Let the plants dry for several weeks, or until it is clearly nonviable.

Chipping - Woody plants that do not reproduce vegetatively. Burying - Lay thick plastic in a deep pit, about three feet deep, and place the plant material into the pit. The plant material should be away from the edge of the plastic before covering it with more thick plastic. Make sure to remove as much air as possible, then toss some soil on top to weigh down the material. This method is risky unless done with diligence.

**Composting -** Non-native invasive plants can take root in compost. Do not compost any invasive plants unless you know there is no viable (living) plant material left. Use one of the methods above first before composting.

To figure out if a plant in your yard is a non-native invasive species, use apps like iNaturalist, Seek, and PictureThis to help identify the plant you are looking at. The links below refer to different resource articles that can be helpful as well.

#### HOMESTEAD PROTECTION

If you owe someone money, with a court order, they can seize your assets to pay that debt, including your home. But Massachusetts Homestead law protects homeowners from being thrown into the street. Every homeowner gets \$125,000 of protection on their home. By filing a Homestead Declaration at the Registry of Deeds, you can increase that protection to \$500,000. In the old days the husband usually filed, now the law is gender neutral and both parties to a marriage (or other joint homeowners) can file for Homestead. There is another protection available only to a married couple and that is called "Tenancy by the Entirety." This older law protected wives from the debts of the husband. It is now gender neutral as well and protects either spouse from the debts of the other. It is recommended that every Massachusetts homeowner file a Declaration of Homestead. (Neither of these laws exist in New Hampshire by the way.)

It is rare that your home would be at risk to creditors, but it could happen. Liability for an accident and other personal financial disasters are the most likely problems. In that case you might be filing for bankruptcy protection. The \$500,000 Homestead exemption would protect your home in bankruptcy. And, even if you had equity above that limit, the creditor could only get a lien on your home and only get paid if and when you sell (or die). The law protects you from being homeless.

A recent case shows some of the limits of Homestead though. In re: Cecilia M. Hector (Mass. Bankruptcy case - 2022) the wife tried to get a gas company lien removed from her property because it was only the debt of her husband, and the house was owned as Tenants by the Entirety. The Court said that she did not owe the debt but that the lien could stay on the house and the Gas Company could get paid when the house was sold as it was a valid debt of the husband. The Tenancy by the Entirety and the prior-filed Homestead Declaration would protect from a forced sale, but not from a lien that would wait until a voluntary sale (that first \$500,000 in equity would not be subject to pay that lien though).

Another key issue is with the specific words in the Homestead Declaration. The State does provide some blank forms for your use, but you can write out a Declaration in any way as long as the right words are there. It must be signed, and the facts stated must be affirmed under the penalty of perjury (meaning you are swearing the facts are true). Some older forms, or a homemade form, might be missing that "under penalty of perjury" language so they would not be valid. In the case of Danny Luu (Mass. Bankruptcy, 2022), that homeowner lost as his declaration was missing that key language. He was still entitled to the \$125,000 automatic protection but did not get the full \$500,000 protection he might have had if his declaration form was valid.

### FINANCIAL FOCUS® What to know about HSAs and FSAs

Paying for health care can be challenging — but are you taking full advantage of all the resources available to you? You might have access to a Health Savings Account (HSA) or a Flexible Spending Account (FSA), so let's look at both.

An HSA is a personal savings account used to pay health care costs. If you're enrolled in a high-deductible health plan, you also may be eligible to contribute to an HSA. You aren't taxed on the money you put into this account or on the earnings generated from your contributions, as long as withdrawals are used for qualified health care costs such as deductibles, copayments and coinsurance. And there's no "use it or lose it" provision with HSAs — the money stays in your account until you use it. In fact, you can carry your HSA with you all the way until retirement, when you can use the money to pay for qualified expenses that Medicare or Medicare Supplement Insurance (Medigap) doesn't cover. In 2023, you can contribute up to \$3,850 to an HSA, or \$4,850 if you're 55 or older; for family coverage, you can put in up to \$7,750.

It's important to keep in mind that your HSA's tax benefits only apply when your withdrawals are used for qualified heath care costs. If you use the money for non-qualified expenses, it is considered taxable income, and you may also face a penalty of 20% on the amount withdrawn. However, once you turn 65, you can use your HSA funds for any purpose without a penalty, though the withdrawals will still count as taxable income.

Now, let's turn to the Flexible Savings Account. An FSA may be available to you if you get health insurance through your employer. And because you fund your FSA with pretax dollars, your contributions can reduce your taxable income. (In 2023, you can contribute up to \$3,050 to an FSA.) Your employer may also choose to contribute to your FSA. Once your account is funded and active, you submit claims with proof of your medical expenses, along with a statement that these expenses aren't covered by your plan, and you can be reimbursed for your costs.

It's helpful to have a good estimate of your yearly medical expenses for a Flexible Savings Account. That's because an FSA generally needs to be spent before the end of the plan year — if you don't use all the money, you can only carry over some of it and any remaining balance is forfeited. (You can carry over up to \$610 from 2023 into 2024.)

You can't contribute to an HSA and a traditional FSA in the same year. But if you have an HSA, you might be able to use what's known as a Limited Purpose Flexible Spending Account (LPFSA) for dental and vision expenses. You'll need to check with your plan to see if this option is available.

Managing your health care expenses should be a key part of your overall financial strategy — so consider putting an HSA or FSA to work for you.



### TYNGSBOROUGH POLICE OFFER HALLOWEEN SAFETY TIPS

During Halloween festivities Chief Richard D. Howe and the Tyngsborough Police Department ask that the community put safety first, especially for those who plan on trick-or-treating or who will be out at night. Halloween, which is celebrated on Oct. 31st, falls on a Tuesday this year. "This holiday is sure to be a fun time for all, whether you're out in your neighborhood gathering candy, or celebrating with friends at home," Chief Howe said. "No matter your choice of activity, always remember to put safety first."

The Centers for Disease Control provides best practices for Halloween trick-or-treaters by asking that people follow the "Safe Halloween" motto. • Swords, knives and other costume accessories should be short, soft and flexible. • Avoid trick-or-treating alone. Walk in groups or with a trusted adult. • Fasten reflective tape on costumes and bags to help drivers see you. • Examine all treats for choking hazards and tampering before you eat them. • Hold a flashlight while walking to ensure that you are visible. • Walk and don't run from house to house. • Always test make up in a small area first. Remove it before bedtime to prevent possible skin and eve irritation. • Lower your risk of serious eye injury by not wearing decorative contact lenses. • Look both ways before crossing the street. Use established crosswalks wherever possible. • Only walk on sidewalks wherever possible, or on the far edge of the road facing traffic to stay safe and to prevent accidents or injury. Wear well-fitting masks, costumes and shoes to avoid blocked vision, trips and falls. • Eat only factory-wrapped candy. Avoid eating homemade treats offered by strangers. • Enter homes only if you're with a trusted adult. Only visit well-lit houses. Don't accept rides from strangers.• Never walk near lit candles or devices with open flames. Be sure to wear flame-resistant costumes.

Those who are planning on attending a party should remember:• Many young children are out for the evening, especially during the peak hours of 6:00-8:00 p.m., so drive slowly! • Not to drive a vehicle while wearing any sort of mask. Your visibility could be obscured.• To have a designated driver if attending an adult Halloween party where alcohol is served.
