- DOG LICENSES All dogs, 6 months and older must be licensed. FEES: Female spayed \$6, Male neutered \$6. Female not spayed \$10 and Male not neutered \$10. Seniors age 70 and older have the fee waived pursuant to a town meeting vote, but the dogs must still be licensed. Please note that you are now able to license your dog online too! Remember: A copy of a current rabies certificate must be on file with the town Clerk. The census and dog applications will be mailed together in December.
- The first election in 2024 will be March 5, 2024. Stay tuned for more news from the town clerks office.

ATTENTION 2024 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation! We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue vour education.

During the winter of 1923, the home of the Morgan family here in town caught fire and was largely destroyed. The citizens of our community responded to the crisis by taking in the children (all 17 of them!), keeping the family together and aiding in the reconstruction of their home. One of the children, Helene Morgan Babcock, remembered the words of her mother, "Never forget the kindness of the people of Dunstable," and so established a scholarship fund to be made available to the graduating students of Dunstable as they continue their education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years of full-time study. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one-time basis (the main scholarship is for 4 year full-time studies only).

Additionally, Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds authorized the Babcock Scholarship Committee to award the Russell G. and Shirley L. Tobey Scholarship, which is a onetime award of \$1,000. Applicants applying for the Babcock Scholarship will be automatically considered for the Tobey Scholarship; there is no additional application required. The Tobey Scholarship recipient will be chosen using the Babcock Scholarship selection

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs.



• December 16 - The Remains of the Day by Kazuo Ishiguro

The main protagonist is Stevens, a traditional English butler—all reserve, discretion, and <u>decorum</u>. The story is set in the 1950s towards the end of Stevens' career, when he is looking back on his years of service and forward to what is left of his life.

• January 20 - The Invention of Wings by Sue Monk Kidd

The Invention of Wings is the fictionalized history of the Grimké sisters, Sarah and Angelina (Nina), who were at the forefront of the abolitionist and women's rights movements, wound around the intriguing narrative of a young slave, Hetty, who was given to Sarah as an 11th birthday present. Sarah despises slavery, even at that early age, and out of principle attempts to reject the gift.

• February 17 - Horse by Geraldine Brooks

Kentucky, 1850. An enslaved groom named Jarret and a bay foal forge a bond of understanding that will carry the horse to record-setting victories across the South. When the nation erupts in civil war, an itinerant young artist who has made his name on paintings of the racehorse takes up arms for the Union. On a perilous night, he reunites with the stallion and his groom, very far from the glamor of any racetrack. Based on the remarkable true story of the record-breaking thoroughbred Lexington, *Horse* is a novel of art and science, love and obsession, and our unfinished reckoning with racism.

• March 16 - Lessons in Chemistry Bonnie Garmus

Lessons in Chemistry is about women's lives, careers, and struggle for empowerment in the late 50s and early 60s. It follows the story of <u>Elizabeth Zott</u>, a brilliant chemist who is forced to become a television chef when she finds herself a young, single mother.

• April 20 - Oxygen by Carol Cassella

Dr. Marie Heaton is an anesthesiologist at the height of her profession. She has worked, lived, and breathed her career since medical school, and she now practices at a top Seattle hospital. Marie has carefully constructed and constricted her life according to empirical truths, to the science and art of medicine. But when her tried-and-true formula suddenly deserts her during a routine surgery, she must explain the nightmarish operating room disaster and face the resulting malpractice suit.

• May 18 - See Me by Nicholas Sparks



• June 15 Sold on a Monday by Kristina McMorris

1931. It's an era of breadlines, bank runs, and impossible choices. For struggling reporter Ellis Reed, the gut-wrenching scene evokes memories of his family's dark past. He snaps a photograph of the children, not meant for publication. But when the image leads to his big break, the consequences are devastating in ways he never imagined. Haunted by secrets of her own, secretary Lillian Palmer sees more in the picture than a good story and is soon drawn into the fray. Together, the two set out to right a wrongdoing and mend a fractured family, at the risk of everything they value.

SCAMS TARGETING THE ELDERLY

There are always scams targeting the elderly. Older persons are more likely to have issues with memory and processing thoughts quickly and can more easily be tricked. Even younger folks can be taken in by a clever scammer. Social Security and Medicare have recently issued warnings about a new round of scams.

The key is that almost all government agencies and elder service agencies never call you directly. They usually communicate by regular mail. They would never call you and ask you for information that they already have like your Social Security Number or your Medicare number. If you get such a call, hang up and don't answer if they call back.

Anyone who calls demanding any sort of immediate payment or threatens you with jail is a scammer. You would have sufficient notice by mail or legal service of process if you owed money or if you were accused of a crime that might put you in jail. You wouldn't get a phone call about that sort of thing at all. If they were really going to arrest you, the police would just show up and do so, they don't give you a chance to pay them off first.

No government agency nor credible social service agency will ask you to pay with a gift card or to wire them money. Those are always a fraud. You should never give out any personal information to anyone who calls you. If you call an agency or company directly, they may ask you for some proof of identity, but most have some way of doing so without you having to give your SSN or other highly private information.

If you are suspicious about a call, just hang up the phone. Look up the purported caller's phone number and call that agency directly to see if they do need to communicate with you. Some scams come by email, so be careful not to click on any links in emails that you don't clearly know are from the actual agency. Always try to look at the return email address. You might have to click on the address bar area of the email, but scam emails often have a long string of numbers or a source that clearly isn't the agency they pretend to be.

Older adults who are targeted by scams and fraud can call the Department of Justice's National Elder Fraud Hotline at 833-372-8311. In addition, scams and fraud targeting people of any age can be reported to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) by calling 877-382-4357 or visiting reportfraud.ftc.gov.

DUNSTABLE PLANNING BOARD

At Town Meeting in May of 1995, The Town of Dunstable voted to designate certain streets as scenic roads within the meaning of "Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40, Section 15C: <u>Scenic road designations; improvements; fines"</u>

The law states: "After a road has been designated as a scenic road any repair, maintenance, reconstruction, or paving work done with respect thereto shall not involve or include the cutting or removal of trees, or the tearing down or destruction of stone walls, or portions thereof, except with the prior written consent of the planning board..."

Please review page 83 of the Town's General Bylaws to see if your street is considered scenic and go to the Planning Board's Forms page for the necessary Scenic Road Request form and instructions for submission. An applicant must request a Scenic Roads hearing and authorization prior to any roadside alterations on their property. HAPPIER HOLIDAYS AND EMPTIER TRASH CARTS



When the cold weather comes, this is the time I enjoy baking more. I haven't put any recipes in for awhile so I thought I would share this very simple one with you. It has been a favorite of mine for years. Sometimes I change things up, using other dried fruits and adding in some nuts.

VANISHING OATMEAL RAISIN COOKIES

½ cup (1 stick) plus 6 tbsp. butter, softened

3/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar

½ cup granulated sugar

2 eggs

- 1 teaspoon vanilla
- 1 ½ cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- ½ teaspoon salt (optional)

3 cups Quaker ® Oats (quick or old fashioned, uncooked) 1 cup raisins

- 1. Heat oven to 350 degrees F. In large bowl, beat butter and sugars on medium speed of electric mixer until creamy.
- 2. Add eggs and vanilla; beat well.
- 3. Add combined flour, baking soda, cinnamon and salt; mix well.
- 4. Add oats and raisins; mix well.
- 5. Drop dough by rounded tablespoonfuls onto ungreased cookie sheets.

Bake 8-10 minutes or until light golden brown. Cool 1 minutes on cookie sheets; remove to wire rack. Cool completely. Store tightly covered. Makes about 4 dozen cookies.

GENERAL COMPUTER TOPICS YEAR IN REVIEW

I thought the end of the year was a good time to review best practices for computers, phones, and tablets. I hope you find them helpful.

First and foremost are passwords. You should have a different password for every online account. These passwords must be long and complex with letters, numbers, and symbols. Since no one can remember all the passwords they have, a Password Manager is highly recommended. These managers encrypt and securely store your passwords for you. Browsers like Chrome, Edge, Safari, and Firefox are better than writing down passwords, but less secure than password managers. Two of the most reliable computer websites recommend BitWarden, Dashlane, 1Password, Keeper, and NordPass. Some have free versions; others have a range of yearly costs. BitWarden has a good free version.

Using open unsecured networks for shopping or banking is not recommended. Examples of an open unsecure network would include airports, hotels, and most public buildings. This includes doctor's offices and hospitals! And, your home network should use a password and encryption. This will protect your personal information.

Quick things to try when a new problem shows up: The first step any user should take when they are having a new problem is to power down and then restart their device. Be sure to save any open documents before you turn off your device. If the device is powered by a plug, remove the plug for 10 seconds after powering down the device. Then plug it back in and restart. This applies to computers, phones, home routers, and any device that attaches to your home Wi-Fi.

Installing new system updates to computers, phones, and tablets is also best practice. This does not mean you have to be the first person to install an update as soon as it is available some people prefer to wait a few weeks in case there is a problem with the new software that needs to be fixed by the company. However, many of these updates do fix security issues that can be exploited by people trying to steal your money or identity, so they are important for you to install. Keeping your devices updated is the key to protecting your device from hackers and thieves.

Even with the most recent updates, you should never click on a link in an email unless you know the sender is a friend or reputable vendor. And never give personal information by text, email, or phone. Specifically, no one should ever ask for your social security number, credit card number, or bank information. And obviously, never reveal your online passwords. If you need any assistance or have any questions, I'd be happy to help. Have a safe and healthy holiday season!





Know the key benefits of Roth IRA

As you save for retirement, you'll want to take full advantage of the investment vehicles available to you — and one of the best is a Roth IRA. But what sets it apart from other accounts? Three key factors distinguish the Roth IRA:

- Tax-free earnings When you invest in a Roth IRA, your earnings can grow tax free, provided you don't begin taking withdrawals until you're 59½ and you've had your account at least five years. If you don't meet these criteria, withdrawals of earnings will be subject to taxes and a possible 10% penalty.
- No penalties on withdrawals of contributions You fund a Roth IRA with after-tax dollars, which means you can withdraw your contributions not the earnings at any time for any reason, without facing taxes or penalties. So, you could use some of your Roth IRA money for non-retirement purposes, such as helping pay for a child's college education.
- No required withdrawals at age 73 With a traditional IRA or a 401(k), you must start taking withdrawals called required minimum distributions, or RMDs once you reach 73. But this rule doesn't apply to a Roth IRA you can keep it intact as long as you like. You may need to tap into it for some of your retirement income, but if you don't use it all, the remainder could benefit your beneficiaries.

A Roth IRA does share one similarity to a traditional IRA: It can be funded with virtually any type of investment, including stocks, bonds, mutual funds, certificates of deposit (CDs) and so on.

However, unlike a traditional IRA, a Roth IRA does have income

For the 2023 tax year, if your modified adjusted gross income was less than \$138,000 (for a single filer) or \$218,000 (married filing jointly), you can put in the full amount of \$6,500 and an additional \$1,000 catch-up contribution if you're 50 or older. The amounts you can contribute will gradually decline at higher income levels and are phased out entirely at \$153,000 for single filers and \$228,000 if you're married and file jointly. These income ranges will likely change for the 2024 tax year, so you'll want to consult with your tax advisor for details.

Still, even if you've contributed to a traditional IRA or a 401(k) for many years, you may have a chance to eventually "convert" some, or all, of these funds to a Roth IRA and gain its benefits. It's not hard to do this conversion — it involves minimal paperwork from your traditional IRA or 401(k) provider — but it does come with tax issues. Any money that's converted from a traditional IRA or 401(k) to a Roth IRA will be treated as ordinary taxable income. This can trigger a large tax bill, so, unless you have the money available from other accounts to pay the taxes, the conversion may or may not make sense for you. But you don't have to convert all the funds at once. By spreading the conversion over several years, you could reduce the effect of a large tax hit in any single year. You may want to consult with your tax advisor before converting any funds to a Roth IRA.

If you can find a way to contribute to a Roth IRA, either directly or through a conversion, consider it carefully — you'll find a lot of upsides to this investment account.
