From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager January 2024

I am pleased to report the following information from Town over the last month. You can find a full version of the Town Manager's report online at tyngsboroughma.gov.

• A big thank you to the Recreation and Parks Committee and Director Alison Page as well as the dozens of volunteers who made the 2023 Festival of Trees possible. With over 130 trees and more than three dozen different raffles, the event featured something for everyone and turned our Town Center into a holiday wonderland.

• The Town is working hard to launch a brand-new town website. Work commenced over the summer and design was finalized this fall. In November, the Town began working with the vendor CivicPlus to start migrating content. We expect the site to be live by the end of February.

• Fiscal Year 2025 Budget Planning is in full swing. Department budget requests were due to the Town Manager on December 21. The Select Board will begin receiving presentations on individual department requests at their January 29 meeting.

• Town Hall and Library staff gathered late in November for an all-staff team building exercise. This was the first time we were able to get all of our staff together to focus on team building and goal setting. It was a productive morning and we're grateful to all of the staff who participated.

• Congratulations to Board of Health Administrative Assistant Angela Lemire who was awarded the Town's first ever TEAMS Award in recognition of her commitment to public service, focus on teamwork and helping others, and delivery of exceptional customer service to her department and other inspectional services departments.

#### SUSTAINABLE TYNGSBOROUGH Announcing Pilot Food Waste Drop-Off Program to begin February 1, 2024

In previous articles, we shared the results of the waste characterization study the Town commissioned that told us almost half (46% by weight) of our collective trash is food or compostable paper waste. Backyard composting of fruit and vegetable scraps as well as napkins, paper plates, etc., can help, but some do not have the room in their yards and also, meat, bones and dairy scraps require commercial composting because backyard composters do not reach temperatures high enough to kill potential pathogens. Using funds from external sources meant to enhance Tyngsborough's recycling and sustainability efforts, Tyngsborough will provide two food waste drop-off bins at the Highway Department's Recycling Center.

What you can place in the drop-off bins: All food scraps, soiled paper products (napkins, paper plates, etc.), certified compostable packaging and tableware (Compostable products must be BPI, CMA, or OK Compost certified). NO Plastic, Metal, Yard Waste, Grass Clippings, Cardboard, Fruit Stickers (important to remove stickers on fruit peels).

You can bring your scraps to the bins at the highway department any time. Just be sure to completely close the lid when you are done. Black Earth will be emptying the bins every week.

\*\* The Holiday Lights recycling collection bin is outside Town Hall until January 15 \*\*

#### TYNGSBOROUGH'S YARD WASTE DROP-OFF SITE! There will no longer be Yard Waste Pick Ups.

The Residential Yard Waste Drop Off Site is located across the street from Town Hall, 25 Bryants Lane. The site is located off Bryant's Lane, closer to the Middlesex Road end. Use of this Yard Waste Drop-Off Site is available to residents only, is free and usage is unlimited during operating hours. Vehicles will enter & exit through the same driveway. Look for the signage on Bryants Lane.

Open daily Tuesday through Friday 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM <u>The site will close the second Saturday in December (weather</u> <u>permitting) and will reopen on the first Tuesday in April.</u>

Please note that the Town will close the site during heavy rain events or snow events. Notices about changes of hours due to weather events will be posted on the Town website & social media.

Yard waste may be dumped from any type of container or left in paper leaf bags. No items should be left in anything other than paper bags. 

The Rain Barrel Program is back! Become part of the solution by ordering your own rain barrel. Climate crisis is intensifying the water cycle, making wet periods wetter and dry periods drier. Severe droughts can make both rainfall and flash flooding more severe, creating weather whiplash events. When heavy rain falls over drought-stricken soils - which is often hard and cracked - it cannot soak into the ground, and becomes runoff. Rain barrels can collect that runoff and repurpose the collected water. # RESOLVE

### TO GET YOUR ESTATE PLANNING DONE By Edward H. Adamsky

New Year's resolutions aren't usually kept, but you should resolve to complete your Estate Planning this year. Don't get hung up on that term "Estate Planning" it just means getting your affairs in order, no matter how much or how little assets you have. Everyone needs to be organized for the inevitable.

For you, during your own life, and to ensure your own well-being, you need a Power of Attorney and a Health Care Directive (Proxy or Power of Attorney for Health). These documents allow your choice of a trusted person to handle your finances and make medical decisions for you if you cannot do it yourself. You have to put these tools in place before you need them, or it will be too late, and your family will have to go through the Guardianship process with the Probate Court.

In addition to getting these legal documents in place, you need to discuss things with your family. You need to go over your feelings about certain types of medical treatment and various scenarios that might arise. Your family needs to know how you feel. There are some tools online to help you think about these things like the "Five Wishes" and the "Conversation Project." At the least just have a general discussion with your family.

If you do have assets, and especially if they are substantial, then you need to plan where they will go when you die. You need a Will, and perhaps a Trust, if your situation is complex or there are people in your family for whom a Trust would make sense (someone with a disability or with a substance abuse issue).

You also need to get your affairs organized in such a way that your Executor or Trustee will be able to figure them out and take over after you have gone. Make lists or your assets, including all bank and investment accounts. Also write down your debts and regular bills. Consider making a full listing of wherever your money goes (like Netflix or your cell-phone company) so they know what things to stop after you die. List out your advisors with their phone and email contacts so your family knows who to talk to for more information. Your family cannot ask you any questions after you are gone (well, at least you cannot answer them) so consider writing down the answers to what you think they might ask. Keep your files organized with copies of tax returns and bank statements so they can have that information.

Lastly, consider planning out your funeral in detail (and maybe even pay for it in advance) so no one has to deal with that in the hours just after your passing. Everything you do to plan and organize will lesson burdens for your family when they are in a time of grief. It's a gift that will mean a lot, and so, it's a New Year's Resolution that you should keep. See your Estate Planning and Elder Law Attorney now!

#### FINANCIAL FOCUS<sup>®</sup> <u>New Year's Financial Resolutions</u>

Now that we've reached 2024, you might be thinking about your goals and hopes for the new year. But in addition to whatever personal resolutions you might make — volunteering, going to the gym more, learning a new language and others — why not make some *financial* resolutions, too?

#### Here are a few to consider:

• **Boost your retirement savings**. If you can afford it, try to increase your contributions to your IRA and 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan. The more you put away in these accounts, the greater your chances of reaching your retirement goals. At a minimum, contribute enough to your 401(k) to earn your employer's match, if one is offered. And whenever your salary goes up, consider raising the amount you put in to your 401(k).

• **Reduce your debts**. It's not always easy to reduce your debts — but it's worth the effort. The lower your debt load, the greater your monthly cash flow. So, look for ways to consolidate debts or find other, possibly more productive, ways of using credit. And if you truly can't afford something that's nonessential, don't go into debt for it. "Live within your means" is an old piece of advice, but it's just as valid now as ever.

• **Build an emergency fund.** If you suddenly needed a major home or car repair, or received a large medical bill not fully covered by insurance, would you have the funds available? If not, you might be forced to dip into your retirement accounts or other long-term investments. To avoid this possibility, try to build an emergency fund containing several months' worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account that's separate from the ones you use to meet your daily expenses. It can take a while to build such a fund, but if you make it a priority and contribute regular amounts each month, you can make good progress.

• Avoid emotional decisions. Too many people overreact to events in the financial markets because they let their emotions get the better of them. If the market is temporarily down, it doesn't mean you need to sell investments to "cut your losses" — especially if these investments still have good fundamentals and are still appropriate for your portfolio. It can be hard to ignore market volatility, but you'll be better off if you focus on the long term and continue following an investment strategy that's designed to meet your needs.

Review your goals. Over time, your goals may have changed. For example, while you once might have wanted to retire early, and planned for it, you may now find that you'd like to work a few more years. If that's the case, you may also need to adjust your financial and investment strategies.
Revisit your estate plans. If you've married, divorced, remarried or added children to your family within the past few years, you may need to review the account titling and beneficiary designations on your 401(k) and other retirement assets, along with your estate-planning documents, such as your will or living trust. You might also need to revise these documents in other ways.

Of course, you may not be able to tackle all these resolutions at one time, but if you can work at them throughout the year, you can potentially brighten your financial outlook in 2024 — and beyond.


