Just a friendly reminder that **Nomination Papers** are available at Town Hall through April 8th at 5pm **and must be submitted with signatures no later than Thursday, April 11th 5pm.** Candidates must have twenty (20) certified voter's signatures on their nomination papers to have their name placed on the ballot. Wednesday, April 17, 2024 is the last day for objections/withdrawals from the race.

The Annual Town Election will be held on May 21, 2024. Things you need to know:

- If you are not currently registered to vote, the last day to register is May 10, 2024.
- Vote by Mail applications are due by Thursday, May 16th.
- Vote by Mail ballots must be returned to the Dunstable Town Hall by 8pm on May 21, 2024. There is a locked ballot box available 24x7 outside of the side entrance.

Early voting will be held at Town Hall on the following days/

times: Saturday, May 11th 9am-3pm Monday, May 13th 9am-5pm Tuesday, May 14th 9am-5pm Wednesday, May 15th 9am-5pm Thursday, May 16th 9am-5pm

Polls will be open from 12pm - 8pm on May 21, 2024. All voters will vote at the Dunstable Public Library.

CAPITAL GAINS TAX AND INHERITANCES By Edward H. Adamsky

Whenever you earn money such as by selling an item for a profit, or wages at a job, you have to pay income-tax. The tax is based on your profit. Wages are all "profit" as your time cannot be deducted as an expense. When you sell an item for more than you paid for it, the taxable profit is the difference between your purchase price and the sale price. Another name for your purchase price is your "basis." Basis can be different though. For instance, if you bought a house for \$200,000, but then put another \$100,000 into an addition, your total basis in the house is \$300,000.

One component of the income-tax is that you pay a lower rate on some gains. Wages are considered "ordinary" income, and you pay the regular tax rate. But, if you bought real estate or stock, and held it for more than one year, when you sell it, your profit is taxed at a lower "capital-gains" rate. This is an incentive to get people to invest and hold for a longer term. It may not be fair to working folks, but it is believed that this is good for the economy overall.

One of the exceptions to having to pay income tax on money you receive is when you receive it as a gift or inheritance. This is not counted as income, and you don't have to pay any tax when you inherit assets. If you inherited \$100,000 from your parents, you just get to keep it all without paying any tax. This is a rare rule that we should all be happy about.

But say you inherited a house from your parents, and your parents only paid \$100,000 for it. If you sell it for \$500,000, do you have to pay income tax on the \$400,000 of profit? In most cases the answer is "no" because of something in the Tax code called the "adjustment in basis" (commonly called the "step-up" in basis). When you inherit an asset, instead of using the basis of the person you got it from, you get to use the fair-market value on their date of death. So, you won't pay any tax on the sale of your parents house, if the sale price is the same as the value when they died.

This is a concept you should know and understand when planning for yourself or your family. You can make mistakes that cost your family money. You only get the step-up in basis through an inheritance. You don't get it with an outright gift. If your parents gave you their house while they were still alive, you would have to use their basis to calculate your gain and the tax due when you sell the house. The step-up only comes through an inheritance at death.

There are reasons to do lifetime gifts, so the decision is not simple, but you need to think through the ramifications of lifetime gifts and inheritances before you make a mistake. You should consult with your financial advisor and your estate-planning attorney before making any large lifetime gifts and to determine the best tax consequences for your estate planning.

Call this number daily, once you have your permit to check if conditions are okay to burn on that day.

You must follow all the rules and regulations that are listed below.

Rules and Regulations

- 1. You can only burn brush and garden trimmings only.
- 2. Burning is allowed only between 10am and 4pm. No fire shall be started after 12 noon and all fires must be extinguished by 4pm.
- 3. The permit holder must call the Fire Department @ 978-649-6661 each day after 9am for permission to burn that day.
- 4. The fire must not be left unattended and must be at least 75 feet from any structure.
- 5. Have available water supply, rakes, shovels, etc. for controlling the fire.

Under all Circumstances the following are prohibited

- 1. The burning of Grass, Hay, Leaves, Stumps, tires and/or building materials.
- 2. Burning of brush, trees, cane and/or driftwood from commercial and/or institutional land clearing operations.
- 3. Burning at landfills or refuse disposal facilities other than approved incinerators.
- 4. Large piles that will not readily burn or are of such size that they will not be totally out by 4pm.

STONE WALLS AND SCENIC ROADS

Refer to Massachusetts General Laws, Title VII, Chapter 40, Section 15C: Scenic road designations; improvements; fines: https://malegislature.gov/Laws/GeneralLaws/Partl/TitleVII/Chapter40/Section15C

The stone walls lining many roads and tracing through the woods and fields of Dunstable date mostly from the 18th and 19th centuries. They were built to get rid of stones from our glacier-impacted soils and were used for controlling livestock and, increasingly, as boundary markers. (A split rail fence – one rail set upon crossed fence posts – might be added, supplemented, or replaced by barbed wire after the 1870s.)

Although at first glance the stone walls may appear to some people to be just a pile of rocks, in keeping with a single theme throughout the town, it is important that we maintain their appearance.

These walls have historical and aesthetic value and are legally protected in some locations. One may not alter a "bound wall" – one that forms a boundary between two separately owned properties. In Dunstable and many other towns, walls bordering roads designated as "scenic" by Town Meeting may not be breached, significantly altered, or demolished without permission from the Planning Board after a public hearing. (Refer to the Town's General Bylaws, and subsection "SCENIC ROAD BYLAW" for a listing of designated scenic roads.) Breaching a wall – most often to accommodate a new driveway – is rather straightforward but does require a permit. Repairing or reconstructing a wall involves several considerations.

Stone walls have two natural enemies: vegetation and gravity. Dunstable farmers created stone walls and had to maintain them (sometimes called "mending walls.") This typically simply meant restoring to their place stones which had fallen or rebuilding a collapsed portion. Such repair is certainly permitted by the Town's Scenic Roads Bylaw. (Note: Dunstable's historic walls were always "dry" – NO mortar should ever be used in repairing them.) Adding new stones to a wall is another matter. Stones ex

posed to the elements or "weathered" are gray and often covered with various species of moss and lichens, a process that takes decades. "Raw" stone (i.e., covered by earth until now) stands out for years and should be used sparingly or not at all. On the other hand, some roadside walls get partly buried; it's OK to re-expose the stones. Sometimes one can use nearby stretches of a wall as a guide for height and style, whether mending an existing wall or building a new one where none exists.





WHAT IS A CHROMEBOOK? By Dean Lotito

Chromebooks are laptops, created by Google to provide a much less expensive alternative to a traditional Windows or Mac computer. As a rule, Chromebooks cost from \$200 to about \$600. (For comparison, Windows laptops range from \$500 to \$1,500, and Apple laptops range from \$800 to \$3,000, without finding something on sale.)

A Chromebook can be a good option for people who use their computer mostly for email and browsing the internet. Any task you can accomplish using an Internet Browser (Edge, Chrome, Firefox, Safari, etc.) can be done on a Chromebook. For many users, this is all you need.

You must have (or create) a Google account (Gmail) to use a Chromebook. These accounts are free. In addition, you can create and edit documents and spreadsheets using either Google Docs or Microsoft Office online. (These browser-based apps are also free.) The programs are run from the Cloud, and all documents that are created are stored on the Cloud. It is important to note that Chromebooks rely on internet access for their functionality. This should not be a problem for most users since Wi-Fi at home is so common these days. You can also use Wi-Fi at other locations such as a library or school, or local coffee shop. There are also Apps which can be downloaded to the Chromebook from the Google Play store. This includes games as well as other productivity Apps.

As a rule, I recommend always buying a new Chromebook. I do not recommend buying a USED Chromebook without first researching the original release date. Google provides software and security updates for 10 years from the release date, which is fine for most people, but buying a used Chromebook that is 6 or more years old would leave you with support and updates for only a few more years.

Chromebooks are a less expensive and very workable option for many people. If you need help selecting or setting up your Chromebook, feel free to contact me.

WHEN SHOULD YOU TAKE SOCIAL SECURITY?

One of your important sources of retirement income will likely be Social Security — but when should you start taking it?

You can start collecting Social Security benefits at 62, but your checks will be considerably bigger if you wait until your full retirement age, which is likely between 66 and 67. You could even wait until you're 70, at which point the payments will max out, except for yearly cost-of-living adjustments. But if you need the money, you need the money, even if you're just 62 or any age before full retirement age.

However, if you have adequate financial resources to meet your monthly needs, whether through earned income, your investment portfolio or a combination of the two, you could have some flexibility in choosing when to take Social Security. In this case, you may want to weigh these considerations:

- Life expectancy For all of us, it's one of life's great mysteries: How long will we live? Of course, we can't see into the future, so the question can't be answered with total confidence. But to make an informed decision on when to take Social Security, you don't need to know your exact lifespan you just need to make a reasonably good estimate. So, for example, if you're approaching 62, you're enjoying excellent health and you have a family history of longevity, you might conclude it's worth waiting a few years to collect Social Security, so you can receive the bigger payments. Conversely, if your health is questionable and your family has not been fortunate in terms of longevity, you might want to start taking your benefits earlier.
- Employment You can certainly continue working and still receive Social Security benefits. However, if you're under your full retirement age for the entire year, Social Security will deduct \$1 from your benefits for every \$2 you earn above the annual limit of \$22,320. In the year you reach your full retirement age, Social Security will deduct \$1 in benefits for every \$3 you earn above \$59,520. So, you may want to keep these reductions in mind when deciding when to begin accepting benefits. Once you reach your full retirement age, you can earn any amount without losing benefits. (Also, at your full retirement age, Social Security will recalculate your benefit amount to credit you for the months you received reduced benefits because of your excess earnings.)
- Spouse Spouses can receive two types of Social Security benefits: spousal and survivor. With a spousal benefit, your spouse can receive up to 50% of your full retirement benefits, regardless of when you start taking them. (Your spouse's benefit can be reduced by the amount of their own retirement benefit and whether they took Social Security before their full retirement age.) But with a survivor benefit, your decision about when to take Social Security can make a big difference. A surviving spouse can receive the larger of their own benefit or 100% of a deceased spouse's benefit, so if you take benefits early and receive a permanent reduction, your spouse's survivor benefit may also be reduced for their lifetime.


