### STONE WALLS AND SCENIC ROADS

Refer to Massachusetts General Laws, Title VII, Chapter 40, Section 15C: Scenic road designations; improvements; fines: https://malegislature.gov/Laws/GeneralLaws/Partl/TitleVII/ Chapter40/Section15C

The stone walls lining many roads and tracing through the woods and fields of Dunstable date mostly from the 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries. They were built to get rid of stones from our glacier-impacted soils and were used for controlling livestock and, increasingly, as boundary markers. (A split rail fence – one rail set upon crossed fence posts – might be added, supplemented, or replaced by barbed wire after the 1870s.)

Although at first glance the stone walls may appear to some people to be just a pile of rocks, in keeping with a single theme throughout the town, it is important that we maintain their appearance.

These walls have historical and aesthetic value and are legally protected in some locations. One may not alter a "bound wall" – one that forms a boundary between two separately owned properties. In Dunstable and many other towns, walls bordering roads designated as "scenic" by Town Meeting may not be breached, significantly altered, or demolished without permission from the Planning Board after a public hearing. (Refer to the Town's General Bylaws, and subsection "SCENIC ROAD BYLAW" for a listing of designated scenic roads.) Breaching a wall – most often to accommodate a new driveway – is rather straightforward but does require a permit. Repairing or reconstructing a wall involves several considerations.

Stone walls have two natural enemies: vegetation and gravity. Dunstable farmers created stone walls and had to maintain them (sometimes called "mending walls.") This typically simply meant restoring to their place stones which had fallen or rebuilding a collapsed portion. Such repair is certainly permitted by the Town's Scenic Roads Bylaw. (Note: Dunstable's historic walls were always "dry" - NO mortar should ever be used in repairing them.) Adding new stones to a wall is another matter. Stones exposed to the elements or "weathered" are gray and often covered with various species of moss and lichens, a process that takes decades. "Raw" stone (i.e., covered by earth until now) stands out for years and should be used sparingly or not at all. On the other hand, some roadside walls get partly buried; it's OK to re-expose the stones. Sometimes one can use nearby stretches of a wall as a guide for height and style, whether mending an existing wall or building a new one where none exists.

# ATTENTION 2024 HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATES RESIDING IN DUNSTABLE

Congratulations on your pending graduation! We are delighted to announce the availability of the Helene Morgan Babcock and Alfred Babcock Memorial Scholarship, and invite you to apply for these generous funds as you continue vour education.

The amounts of these grants are substantial, with one of the Babcock Scholars receiving \$4,000 each year for up to four years of full-time study. A number of additional \$2,000 scholarships are granted to other students on a one-time basis (the main scholarship is for 4 year full-time studies only).

Additionally, Dunstable's Commissioners of Trust Funds authorized the Babcock Scholarship Committee to award the Russell G. and Shirley L. Tobey Scholarship, which is a onetime award of \$1,000. Applicants applying for the Babcock Scholarship will be automatically considered for the Tobey Scholarship; there is no additional application required. The Tobey Scholarship recipient will be chosen using the Babcock Scholarship selection criteria.

Scholarships may be applied to expenses incurred in the pursuit of advanced education beyond the secondary level in two or four year institutions, vocational education institutions, or formalized apprenticeship programs.

#### AVOID STRESS WHEN DEALING WITH YOUR MEDICAL NEEDS By Edward H. Adamsky

Most people are dissatisfied with the health care system in America. Figuring out how to get the services you need and how to get your insurance to pay for it are agonizing. There isn't a coordinated system anyway, and what we have is very complex. This is especially true for older folks who have trouble dealing with computers and other modern procedures. And, it's even more stressful when you are diagnosed with a medical condition and are worried about that. Getting the help that you need should be easier.

What you need is a Health Care Advocate. You need help coordinating care with multiple providers and insurance companies. You need lists of your medications and health conditions, and you need to schedule appointments and fill out all of the required paperwork for each provider. You can work on this yourself, but having someone to help you can make it much easier.

Your Health Care Advocate can be a family member who goes with you to appointments and helps you fill out forms and keeps records for you. It can also be a paid professional if you don't have a family member handy to do it. Some facilities have on-sight patient advocates and there are professionals who offer these services. There doesn't seem to be any licensing requirement for such a job, but those who handle it are usually medical or social work professionals.

An advocate can be your eyes and ears at medical appointments. They can take notes, ask questions, and provide answers to your medical providers that you might not remember. The advocate can also help explain the doctor's instructions and manage the athome treatments that might follow in-patient services.

If you don't have a close friend or family member who is available to work as your advocate, then you should hire a professional. Ask the hospital if there is one on staff or if they have a referral for you. Or consider finding one by asking your local Senior Center. There is even a website and an organization for this. The Patient Advocate Foundation (www.patientadvocate.org) is a not-for-profit organization that can help you find case management services.

As usual, you need to be careful and be on the lookout for scams. If you search online for a Patient Advocate, make sure you use only reputable sites and avoid anything that looks suspicious. Do not take phone calls from strangers offering to help you. If someone tries to pressure you or makes unrealistic promises regarding your health care, then they are probably not looking out for your best interests.

Your local Elder Law Attorney can also provide some help in this area. Your attorney can provide a referral to a qualified person, or provide you with some direct help and advice on dealing with doctors and insurance companies.

# NASHOBA ASSOCIATED BOARDS OF HEALTH RABIES IMMUNIZATION CLINIC

Rabies immunization for dogs and cats over six (6) months of age, not previously immunized, and those with a blue rosette (2021) rabies tag must be immunized. Depending on the vaccination status of your dog or cat the veterinarian will inform you of the effective vaccination duration for the vaccination given.

# Matt's Monthly Mechanical Memo

The sponsors of the Mass Save program have made major changes to the rebates offered for completing energy efficiency upgrades in homes.

The \$10,000 rebate for installing whole home electric heat pumps in homes with preexisting gas-fired heating systems comes with the requirement that homeowners have those legacy systems permanently disabled or removed.

This differs dramatically from previous years where homeowners could elect to keep a furnace or boiler functional as an emergency back up source should their heat pump breakdown or lose power.

Further, rebates for most homeowners electing to upgrade failing boilers or furnaces to modern, high-efficiency models have been reduced to insignificant amounts and will be discontinued altogether in August of this year.

#### THE GREAT AMERICAN RAIN BARREL PROGRAM HELP CONSERVE WATER AND PROTECT THE ENVIRONMENT

Another Year of Record Flooding and Drought "In recent months, we've seen droughts, flooding, and wildfire smoke across our region. The climate crisis is very much here." - EEA Secretary Rebecca Tepper

After the fourth driest summer in 2022, and the fourth wettest summer in 2021, the summer of 2023 was the <u>second-wettest</u> on record in Boston, with 20 inches of rain in three months. And heavy rains seem to be coming more often. When it rains too much in a matter of hours, Massachusetts towns and cities are struggling to handle all of the water.

This past summer, many communities reported several inches of rain within just a few hours. On August 8, more than 6 inches of rain fell on parts of Massachusetts. Drivers were stranded in their cars. There were hundreds of no swimming days at our beaches this summer. Heavy rains sent bacteria-laden stormwater into the ocean. By October 2, there had been only 5 rain-free weekends since Memorial Day.

Northeast storms have brought at least 1.5 inches of heavy rain in a day and are expected to surge in the coming decades.

### HOW TO BE PART OF THE SOLUTION

Educating and encouraging local residents to use a rain barrel is one of the many ways homeowners can be part of the solution. A rain barrel can collect the runoff from roofs and gutters preventing the rain from making its way to impervious surfaces, which often end up in local streams, rivers, pond, lakes and marine waters. Keeping and using rain water on your property helps reduce pollution, erosion and improves local watershed health.

A 500 square foot roof can fill a properly installed 50-gallon rain barrel in about one hour. A modest amount of rainfall can supply much or all of the outdoor watering needs - a full rain barrel will water a 200-square-foot garden.

#### CONSERVING WATER

During severe drought, rain barrels can provide an additional source of water.

According to the US EPA, 30% of daily water use is outdoors. The EPA also states that rain barrels have the ability to save the average homeowner 1300 gallons of water annually. Using the rain barrel's stored water around the landscape saves water resources and reduces the amount of water purchased from municipal sources.

Rain water is "soft," or free from minerals and chemicals such as chlorine, fluoride, and calcium often present in municipal water. Rainwater is considered ideal for watering plants or washing cars and windows.

Our first meeting of the New Year took place on Tuesday, February 6 at the Evangelical Congregation Church, 23 Kendall Rd. at 7 pm. The program featured Winnie Pead, owner and principal of Garden of Eden LLC, who gave a presentation on ways to increase vegetable garden yields. She touched on all aspects of successful gardening and provided tips on soil composition, water needs , and sunlight, as well as the benefits of pinching back and companion plantings. Her presentation was timely because those of us who grow vegetables all complained of a diminished harvest last year from all the rain.

We have rescheduled our March meeting from March 5 to Tuesday, March 12. The primary elections are on March 5 and several of our members will be working the polls. So, on March 12 Linda Sheldon will present a program on the 2024 herb of the Year--yarrow. "What's that?" you say. It's a common field and garden plant and, in addition to being pretty, it's been used for all sorts of things and has been around for millennia. **Our April 2 meeting** will feature Willa Coronka, owner/principal of the Magpie's Apprentice. Willa has a Master's degree in Environmental Education and her business is devoted to helping people enjoy nature and its bounty in a sustainable way.

# ALTERNATIVES TO PAYING FOR WORD, EXCEL, AND POWERPOINT

Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint are certainly the most popular office tools in use on computers today. Microsoft has several licensing packages available to provide these tools at a reasonable cost. A popular package is \$99/year for up to 5 computers/ phones in your home. This includes 6 terabytes of storage in the cloud. This is the package I use.

However, there are reasonable alternatives that are free. Google released "Google Docs" in 2006. These are web-based applications that support the equivalent of Word (called Docs), Excel (called Sheets), and PowerPoint (called Slides). These websites provide 95% of the features of the Microsoft programs and satisfy all but the most complex power users. Most importantly, these programs save the files in a format that Microsoft programs can usually open. This allows you to create files that you can send to friends who are using Microsoft 365.

The only downside of Google Docs is that you must have an internet connection to access your documents. The documents actually run in your browser (Edge, Firefox, Chrome Safari, etc.) This should not be an issue for most users, but it is important to be aware of it. Google stores these documents in the Google Cloud by default. Having a Google account is free, and all people with a Google Account get some free storage. (And if you have a Gmail address you already have a Google account.) Just open your browser and go to www.google.com. In the upper right-hand corner are nine dots in a square, which is the menu button to open these programs.

In response to Google Docs, Microsoft also created an online free version of Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. As in the case of Google Docs, these are web-based applications that you can access with a free Microsoft account. If you are currently using a Windows PC, you likely have such a Microsoft account. Just open your browser and go to <a href="https://www.office.com">www.office.com</a> . Click on the link for the free version of Microsoft 365.

If you are only an occasional PC user, these free alternatives may be a good option. Give them a try! If you have any questions or would like help converting to either of these options, I am available to help.
