TYNGSBOROUGH'S TOWN MANAGER REPORT

From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager
April 2024

- •The Tyngsborough Sewer Commission was notified last month that it was awarded a federal grant of \$480,000 for a capacity project in Town. This comes the same year that the Commission received nearly \$900,000 in a congressional earmark for design of the next phase.
- •The Residential Yard-Waste Drop Off site formally re-opened for the season on April 2nd. You can learn more about using the site by visiting tyngsboroughma.gov and selecting "Trash and Recycling" under the "Residents" tab.
- •The 17th Annual Town-Wide Clean Up takes place during the month of April in Tyngsborough. Residents are encouraged to grab a friend or friends and clean up their favorite area in Town! This could be your street, your favorite park, or sport field! Materials are available at the Town Hall and Highway Garage. Simply fill up the bright yellow bags with trash and leave them on the curb. The program is sponsored by the Tyngsborough Highway Department, Board of Health, and Sustainability Committee.
- •Hazardous material abatement at the Winslow School was completed last month. This was funded by two separate Town Meeting appropriations and included the removal of two underground storage tanks, abatement of asbestos containing materials throughout the building, and limited lead abatement.
- •Design work on the partial demolition, exterior restoration of the original school house, and relocation of the Winslow School is in full swing. The direction of this project comes from the May 2023 Annual Town Meeting vote where voters voted to fund \$1.5M to demolish the additions on the Winslow School, restore the exterior envelope of the original school house, relocate the school house closer to Winslow and regrade the site so that the school becomes at grade for accessibility benefits. Once design is final, assuming cost-estimates are within then project, the construction portion of the project will go out to bid.
- Work on the Police Department parking lot project will commence this month. The project will see the repaving of the entire parking lot and accessibility improvements. This project was funded by the Capital Asset Management Committee as a part of their Fy24 Capital Plan.
- •The FY2025 budget is available for review at tyngsboroughma.gov under the Town Manager tab on the website.

A reminder that the Annual Town Meeting will take place on Tuesday, May 7, 2024 at 7 PM at Tyngsborough Elementary School and the Town Election will take place on Tuesday, May 21, 2024.

CAPITAL GAINS TAX AND INHERITANCES

Whenever you earn money such as by selling an item for a profit, or wages at a job, you have to pay income-tax. The tax is based on your profit. Wages are all "profit" as your time cannot be deducted as an expense. When you sell an item for more than you paid for it, the taxable profit is the difference between your purchase price and the sale price. Another name for your purchase price is your "basis." Basis can be different though. For instance, if you bought a house for \$200,000, but then put another \$100,000 into an addition, your total basis in the house is \$300,000.

One component of the income-tax is that you pay a lower rate on some gains. Wages are considered "ordinary" income, and you pay the regular tax rate. But, if you bought real estate or stock, and held it for more than one year, when you sell it, your profit is taxed at a lower "capital-gains" rate. This is an incentive to get people to invest and hold for a longer term. It may not be fair to working folks, but it is believed that this is good for the economy overall.

One of the exceptions to having to pay income tax on money you receive is when you receive it as a gift or inheritance. This is not counted as income, and you don't have to pay any tax when you inherit assets. If you inherited \$100,000 from your parents, you just get to keep it all without paying any tax. This is a rare rule that we should all be happy about.

But say you inherited a house from your parents, and your parents only paid \$100,000 for it. If you sell it for \$500,000, do you have to pay income tax on the \$400,000 of profit? In most cases the answer is "no" because of something in the Tax code called the "adjustment in basis" (commonly called the "step-up" in basis). When you inherit an asset, instead of using the basis of the person you got it from, you get to use the fair-market value on their date of death. So, you won't pay any tax on the sale of your parents house, if the sale price is the same as the value when they died.

This is a concept you should know and understand when planning for yourself or your family. You can make mistakes that cost your family money. You only get the step-up in basis through an inheritance. You don't get it with an outright gift. If your parents gave you their house while they were still alive, you would have to use their basis to calculate your gain and the tax due when you sell the house. The step-up only comes through an inheritance at death.

There are reasons to do lifetime gifts, so the decision is not simple, but you need to think through the ramifications of lifetime gifts and inheritances before you make a mistake. You should consult with your financial advisor and your estate-planning attorney before making any large lifetime gifts and to determine the best tax consequences for your estate planning.



SENIOR CIRCUIT BREAKER TAX CREDIT

As a senior citizen (65 or older), you may be eligible to claim a refundable credit on your Massachusetts personal income tax return. The Circuit Breaker tax credit is based on the actual real estate taxes or rent paid on residential property you own or rent and occupy as your principal residence. This credit is available even if your income level does not require you to file a Massachusetts income tax return.

The maximum credit amount for tax year 2023 is \$2,590.

- · Applicants must meet income guidelines.
- Homeowners: Property value limit is \$1,025,000 and your property taxes together with half of your water and sewer expense, must exceed 10% of your total Massachusetts income for the tax year.
- Renters: 25% of your annual rent must exceed 10% of your total income for the tax year.







WHAT IS A CHROMEBOOK? By Dean Lotito

Chromebooks are laptops, created by Google to provide a much less expensive alternative to a traditional Windows or Mac computer. As a rule, Chromebooks cost from \$200 to about \$600. (For comparison, Windows laptops range from \$500 to \$1,500, and Apple laptops range from \$800 to \$3,000, without finding something on sale.)

A Chromebook can be a good option for people who use their computer mostly for email and browsing the internet. Any task you can accomplish using an Internet Browser (Edge, Chrome, Firefox, Safari, etc.) can be done on a Chromebook. For many users, this is all you need.

You must have (or create) a Google account (Gmail) to use a Chromebook. These accounts are free. In addition, you can create and edit documents and spreadsheets using either Google Docs or Microsoft Office online. (These browser-based apps are also free.) The programs are run from the Cloud, and all documents that are created are stored on the Cloud. It is important to note that Chromebooks rely on internet access for their functionality. This should not be a problem for most users since Wi-Fi at home is so common these days. You can also use Wi-Fi at other locations such as a library or school, or local coffee shop. There are also Apps which can be downloaded to the Chromebook from the Google Play store. This includes games as well as other productivity Apps.

As a rule, I recommend always buying a new Chromebook. I do not recommend buying a USED Chromebook without first researching the original release date. Google provides software and security updates for 10 years from the release date, which is fine for most people, but buying a used Chromebook that is 6 or more years old would leave you with support and updates for only a few more years.

Chromebooks are a less expensive and very workable option for many people. If you need help selecting or setting up your Chromebook, feel free to contact me.

You could even wait until you're 70, at which point the payments will max out, except for yearly cost-of-living adjustments. But if you need the money, you need the money, even if you're just 62 or any age before full retirement age.

However, if you have adequate financial resources to meet your monthly needs, whether through earned income, your investment portfolio or a combination of the two, you could have some flexibility in choosing when to take Social Security. In this case, you may want to weigh these considerations:

- Life expectancy For all of us, it's one of life's great mysteries: How long will we live? Of course, we can't see into the future, so the question can't be answered with total confidence. But to make an informed decision on when to take Social Security, you don't need to know your exact lifespan you just need to make a reasonably good estimate. So, for example, if you're approaching 62, you're enjoying excellent health and you have a family history of longevity, you might conclude it's worth waiting a few years to collect Social Security, so you can receive the bigger payments. Conversely, if your health is questionable and your family has not been fortunate in terms of longevity, you might want to start taking your benefits earlier.
- Employment You can certainly continue working and still receive Social Security benefits. However, if you're under your full retirement age for the entire year, Social Security will deduct \$1 from your benefits for every \$2 you earn above the annual limit of \$22,320. In the year you reach your full retirement age, Social Security will deduct \$1 in benefits for every \$3 you earn above \$59,520. So, you may want to keep these reductions in mind when deciding when to begin accepting benefits. Once you reach your full retirement age, you can earn any amount without losing benefits. (Also, at your full retirement age, Social Security will recalculate your benefit amount to credit you for the months you received reduced benefits because of your excess earnings.)
- Spouse Spouses can receive two types of Social Security benefits: spousal and survivor. With a spousal benefit, your spouse can receive up to 50% of your full retirement benefits, regardless of when you start taking them. (Your spouse's benefit can be reduced by the amount of their own retirement benefit and whether they took Social Security before their full retirement age.) But with a survivor benefit, your decision about when to take Social Security can make a big difference. A surviving spouse can receive the larger of their own benefit or 100% of a deceased spouse's benefit, so if you take benefits early and receive a permanent reduction, your spouse's survivor benefit may also be reduced for their lifetime.
