### TYNGSBOROUGH'S TOWN MANAGER **REPORT**

From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager March 2024

I am pleased to report the following information from Town over the last month. You can find a full version of the Town Manager's report online at tyngsboroughma.gov.

- Last month, we launched our revamped Town website at www. tyngsboroughma.gov. The focus of this project was to provide residents and local businesses the information they need in a clear, concise, and easy-to-find manner. As we continue to work the new website to be the best version it can be, please feel free to send your comments/suggestions/complaints to tech@tyngsboroughma. gov.
- At the Select Board's last meeting in January, I presented my initial recommended budget for Fiscal Year 2025. The budget represents a 3.7% increase over Fiscal Year 2024 and delivers the same level of service that residents have come to expect without drastic cuts or overrides. In the coming weeks, some of the numbers will shake out and I look forward to continuing to engage with elected & appointed officials, staff, and residents alike to finalize this budget ahead of Town Meeting. You can view the entire budget and budget presentation on the Town website.
- The new Middle School project is moving along on schedule. I joined members of School Administration, the Select Board, School Committee, and Middle School Building Committee for a walk through of the site. We were also notified that the relief funding that the Town is getting through the Commonwealth will be \$4.6 million instead of the original \$4.1 million we were told in October which is

### REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTIONS AVAILABLE

You may be eligible to receive a property tax exemption if you fall into any of these categories: Legally blind person; Veteran with a service-connected disability; Surviving spouse of a disabled veteran or veteran who died from active-duty injury or illness; Senior citizen age 65 and older, who meets income and asset requirements. You must have owned and occupied your property as of 7/1/2023. Supporting documentation is required for all exemption applications. Applications are available at the Assessors Office in Town Hall, or at www.tyngsboroughma.gov/departments/assessors. Applications for FY2024 are due to the Assessors Office by April 1, 2024. The Rain Barrel Program is back!

Become part of the solution by ordering your own rain barrel. Climate crisis is intensifying the water cycle, making wet periods wetter and dry periods drier. Severe droughts can make both rainfall and flash flooding more severe, creating weather whiplash events. When heavy rain falls over drought-stricken soils - which is often hard and cracked - it cannot soak into the ground, and becomes runoff. Rain barrels can collect that runoff and repurpose the collected water. Tyngsborough, Dunstable and Pepperell are collaborating again to provide residents the opportunity to buy their own rain barrels through The Great American Rain Barrel Company.

The sponsors of the Mass Save program have made major changes to the rebates offered for completing energy efficiency upgrades in homes.

The \$10,000 rebate for installing whole home electric heat pumps in homes with preexisting gas-fired heating systems comes with the requirement that homeowners have those legacy systems permanently disabled or removed.

This differs dramatically from previous years where homeowners could elect to keep a furnace or boiler functional as an emergency back up source should their heat pump breakdown or lose power.

Further, rebates for most homeowners electing to upgrade failing boilers or furnaces to modern, high-efficiency models have been reduced to insignificant amounts and will be discontinued altogether in August of this year. Until next month, stay comfortable.

### SUSTAINABLE TYNGSBOROUGH

Great job Tyngsborough - *you brought 600 pounds* of holiday string lights to town hall to be recycled! There are several opportunities coming up for residents to contribute to the sustainability efforts of our town and our planet.

- Food Waste Drop-off bins are available at the Highway Department. Several residents have begun bringing their food waste to these bins. As more residents participate in this program, we can reduce even more the amount of food waste in our curbside trash (measured as 40% of our curbside trash in October, 2022), saving the town on trash disposal fees and turning food waste into rich compost for healthier soil.
- Rain barrels are a great solution for collecting roof runoff to reduce the amount of water that flows from your property, holding it for later use such as on lawns, gardens or indoor plants. It's a great way to conserve water and aid in stormwater management. Rain barrels are available for purchase by residents at the discounted price of \$89.00. ### SENIOR CIRCUIT BREAKER TAX CREDIT

As a senior citizen (65 or older), you may be eligible to claim a refundable credit on your Massachusetts personal income tax return. The Circuit Breaker tax credit is based on the actual real estate taxes or rent paid on residential property you own or rent and occupy as your principal residence. This credit is available even if your income level does not require you to file a Massachusetts income tax return.

The maximum credit amount for tax year 2023 is \$2,590.

Applicants must meet income guidelines.

- Homeowners: Property value limit is \$1,025,000 and your property taxes together with half of your water and sewer expense, must exceed 10% of your total Massachusetts income for the tax year.
- Renters: 25% of your annual rent must exceed 10% of your total income for the tax year.

## AVOID STRESS WHEN DEALING WITH YOUR MEDICAL NEEDS

Most people are dissatisfied with the health care system in America. Figuring out how to get the services you need and how to get your insurance to pay for it are agonizing. There isn't a coordinated system anyway, and what we have is very complex. This is especially true for older folks who have trouble dealing with computers and other modern procedures. And, it's even more stressful when you are diagnosed with a medical condition and are worried about that. Getting the help that you need should be easier.

What you need is a Health Care Advocate. You need help coordinating care with multiple providers and insurance companies. You need lists of your medications and health conditions, and you need to schedule appointments and fill out all of the required paperwork for each provider. You can work on this yourself, but having someone to help you can make it much easier.

Your Health Care Advocate can be a family member who goes with you to appointments and helps you fill out forms and keeps records for you. It can also be a paid professional if you don't have a family member handy to do it. Some facilities have on-sight patient advocates and there are professionals who offer these services. There doesn't seem to be any licensing requirement for such a job, but those who handle it are usually medical or social work professionals.

An advocate can be your eyes and ears at medical appointments. They can take notes, ask questions, and provide answers to your medical providers that you might not remember. The advocate can also help explain the doctor's instructions and manage the at-home treatments that might follow in-patient services.

If you don't have a close friend or family member who is available to work as your advocate, then you should hire a professional. Ask the hospital if there is one on staff or if they have a referral for you. Or consider finding one by asking your local Senior Center. There is even a website and an organization for this. The Patient Advocate Foundation (www.patientadvocate.org) is a not-for-profit organization that can help you find case management services.

As usual, you need to be careful and be on the lookout for scams. If you search online for a Patient Advocate, make sure you use only reputable sites and avoid anything that looks suspicious. Do not take phone calls from strangers offering to help you. If someone tries to pressure you or makes unrealistic promises regarding your health care, then they are probably not looking out for your best interests.

Your local Elder Law Attorney can also provide some help in this area. Your attorney can provide a referral to a qualified person, or provide you with some direct help and advice on dealing with doctors and insurance companies.

# MIDDLESEX SHERIFF'S OFFICE ANNOUNCES REGISTRATION FOR THE 2024 YOUTH PUBLIC SAFETY ACADEMY IS OPEN

Middlesex Sheriff Peter J. Koutoujian is pleased to announce registration for the 2024 Youth Public Safety Academy (YPSA) is now open.

Now in its 24th year, YPSA is an educational and affordable summer program that is open to all children living in Middlesex County ages 8-12. Older children have the opportunity to become a Counselor-in-Training. The program is comprised of five, one-week camps and is held at the Middlesex Sheriff's Office Training Academy in Chelmsford.

Registration for each week is \$100 per child and includes transportation to and from designated bus stops; daily breakfast and lunch; and a graduation ceremony held each Friday.

"YPSA is a proud tradition here at the Middlesex Sheriff's Office," said Sheriff Koutoujian. "This is an opportunity for our kids to take some time away from screens and schools to learn lessons regarding healthy habits, fire safety, personal wellness and more. Most importantly, they can do this alongside their friends and public safety role models from their community, helping build lifelong and positive connections."

Participants are not required to reside in communities with a designated bus stop, but they will be picked up and dropped off at these locations. Cadets from Billerica and Chelmsford will be dropped off and picked up at the Middlesex Sheriff's Office Training Academy.

Currently, spots remain open for cadets at the following bus stop locations: July 8-12 – Bedford & Lexington July 15-19 – Arlington, Billerica, Burlington & Tyngsborough July 22-26 – Acton/Maynard, Framingham/Natick & Marlborough July 29-Aug 2 – Belmont/Watertown, Hudson, Wakefield & Waltham/Newton

Aug 5-9 - Chelmsford, Lowell, Tewksbury & Wilmington

Buses for Malden, Medford and Woburn have reached capacity, however individuals may still add their names to the waiting lists for Medford and Woburn.

#### GIVE YOUR BEST By Eric Paquette

God expects our best to be offered to Him and not our leftovers. God is asking the Jews in Malachi 1:8, "And when you offer the blind as a sacrifice is it not evil? And when you offer the lame and sick is it not evil?" It is also evil and sinful when we don't give our best to God. In the Old Testament, God commanded the Jews to give to Him "the first fruits of your harvest" (Lev 23:10). God demands our best be given to Him today. We are to "present your bodies as a living sacrifice" to the Lord (Rom 12:1). We are to "seek first the kingdom of God" (Matt 6:33), and "Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth" (Col 3:2).



## ALTERNATIVES TO PAYING FOR WORD, EXCEL, AND POWERPOINT

Microsoft Word, Excel, and PowerPoint are certainly the most popular office tools in use on computers today. Microsoft has several licensing packages available to provide these tools at a reasonable cost. A popular package is \$99/year for up to 5 computers/phones in your home. This includes 6 terabytes of storage in the cloud. This is the package I use.

However, there are reasonable alternatives that are free. Google released "Google Docs" in 2006. These are web-based applications that support the equivalent of Word (called Docs), Excel (called Sheets), and PowerPoint (called Slides). These websites provide 95% of the features of the Microsoft programs and satisfy all but the most complex power users. Most importantly, these programs save the files in a format that Microsoft programs can usually open. This allows you to create files that you can send to friends who are using Microsoft 365.

The only downside of Google Docs is that you must have an internet connection to access your documents. The documents actually run in your browser (Edge, Firefox, Chrome Safari, etc.) This should not be an issue for most users, but it is important to be aware of it. Google stores these documents in the Google Cloud by default. Having a Google account is free, and all people with a Google Account get some free storage. (And if you have a Gmail address you already have a Google account.) Just open your browser and go to <a href="https://www.google.com">www.google.com</a>. In the upper right-hand corner are nine dots in a square, which is the menu button to open these programs.

In response to Google Docs, Microsoft also created an online free version of Word, Excel, and PowerPoint. As in the case of Google Docs, these are web-based applications that you can access with a free Microsoft account. If you are currently using a Windows PC, you likely have such a Microsoft account. Just open your browser and go to <a href="https://www.office.com">www.office.com</a>. Click on the link for the free version of Microsoft 365.

If you are only an occasional PC user, these free alternatives may be a good option. Give them a try! If you have any questions or would like help converting to either of these options, I am available to help.


