

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO MAKE YOUR **OWN HEALTH DECISIONS**

Every person in America has the right to make their own health decisions. Doctors and other medical professionals can suggest treatments that they think you should have, but only you get to decide if you want to accept that treatment or not. No one else gets to make the decision except you. You have the right to choose. You can say "Yes" to treatments you want. You can say "No" to any treatment that you don't want - even if the treatment might keep you alive longer.

Your doctor should tell you about your medical condition and the treatment alternatives available. Many treatments have "side effects." Your doctor must offer you information about problems that medical treatment is likely to cause you. Often, more than one treatment might help you – and people have different ideas about which is best. Your doctor can tell you which treatments are available to you, but your doctor can't choose for you. That choice is yours to make and depends on what is important to you.

You can ask others for help in making the decision. You might want to consult with your family, with a religious advisor, or with another medical professional. You can get information from books, online, and from other medical professionals. But, in the end, you will make the final decision.

If you are not able to make your own decisions, because you are unconscious, or are unable to communicate your choices, then no one else can make your decisions for you, unless you have authorized them to do so in writing. This can be done by signing a Medical Directive or Health Care Proxy in advance. With that document you grant permission to a person of your choosing to make those future medical decisions for you if and when you cannot. You can also provide some written guidance regarding your wishes.

In many states you can sign, and also have your doctor sign, a Medical Order for Life Sustaining Treatment. This can specify your wishes for some typical treatments like CPR, intubation, and dialysis. You can say that you do or do not want any of these treatments. With your doctor's signature on this form, other medical professionals will follow those wishes.

After you choose an agent, and before you finalize that decision in writing, you should talk to that person about what you want. Sometimes treatment decisions are hard to make, and it truly helps if your agent knows what you want. You should have a frank discussion about life and death, and quality of life in regard to medical care. You want your agent to make the same decision that you

You can always change your mind and sign a new Directive or Proxy naming a different person as your Agent, or have the written order by your doctor changed or discarded. You are always in charge of your own medical decisions. Consult with your Elder Law Attorney about getting a Health Care Proxy in place.

NOTICE OF RENEWAL FOR TRASH RECYCLING ALL SUBSCRIPTIONS EXPIRE ON JUNE 30, 2024

The Board of Health just renewed their contract with F. W. Shaw & Son for another 3 years. Their bid prices are very so it will allow the Board of Health to again offer a reasonable subscription price for this year. The fee will remain at \$360.00. Overflow bag prices also remain the same at \$3.00 each in rolls of five for \$15.00.

Bulky item prices have increased (please see attached) however, the Board is excited to announce a new program available beginning July 1st to all Dunstable residents for the disposal of mattresses. We have partnered with UTEC (United Team Equality Center) a nonprofit entity, to offer the disposal of mattresses for \$40.00 each. Mattresses will be picked up curbside monthly on a Tuesday by appointment. Part of the proceeds will go to helping youth at risk. To reserve a pickup please use one of these options. The Board would also like to thank all who continue to use the recycling boxes located on Pleasant Street. These boxes have allowed hundreds of tons of recycling materials to be diverted from the waste stream and converted into reusable items.

The Board of Health has adopted a new regulation to impose a one-month late fee (\$30.00) to all existing subscribers whose payment is not received by June 30th

Beginning May 1, three renewal options are available.

- **1.**You may pay on line on the town webpage www.dunstable-ma.gov and choose online payments. Scroll down halfway to Trash-Board of Health. New subscribers can use the same options.
- **2**.You may mail a \$360.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827. Please include your name, address, phone number and email address.
- **3.**You may drop off a check or cash at the Town Hall Monday-Thursday (upper level) 9:00-4:00 p.m. Please write Joan Trash Payment on your envelope. Please make sure your name, address, phone number and email address are included. You may also drop the payment in the outside mailbox of the town hall located by the side door.

Overflow bags can also be purchased online or at the town hall for those times you may have extra trash that will not fit into the trash container. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of five for \$15.00. Bags may be picked up at the town hall Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. Bring a copy of your receipt if you pay online.

STONE WALLS AND SCENIC ROADS

Refer to Massachusetts General Laws, Title VII, Chapter 40, Section 15C: Scenic road designations; improvements; fines: https://malegislature.gov/Laws/GeneralLaws/PartI/TitleVII/ Chapter40/Section15C

The stone walls lining many roads and tracing through the woods and fields of Dunstable date mostly from the 18th and 19th centuries. They were built to get rid of stones from our glacier-impacted soils and were used for controlling livestock and, increasingly, as boundary markers. (A split rail fence – one rail set upon crossed fence posts – might be added, supplemented, or replaced by barbed wire after the 1870s.)

Although at first glance the stone walls may appear to some people to be just a pile of rocks, in keeping with a single theme throughout the town, it is important that we maintain their appearance.

These walls have historical and aesthetic value and are legally protected in some locations. One may not alter a "bound wall" one that forms a boundary between two separately owned properties. In Dunstable and many other towns, walls bordering roads designated as "scenic" by Town Meeting may not be breached, significantly altered, or demolished without permission from the Planning Board after a public hearing. (Refer to the Town's General Bylaws, and subsection "SCENIC ROAD BYLAW" for a listing of designated scenic roads.) Breaching a wall - most often to accommodate a new driveway – is rather straightforward but does require a permit. Repairing or reconstructing a wall involves several considerations.

Stone walls have two natural enemies: vegetation and gravity. Dunstable farmers created stone walls and had to maintain them (sometimes called "mending walls.") This typically simply meant restoring to their place stones which had fallen or rebuilding a collapsed portion. Such repair is certainly permitted by the Town's Scenic Roads Bylaw. (Note: Dunstable's historic walls were always "dry" – NO mortar should ever be used in repairing them.) Adding new stones to a wall is another matter. Stones exposed to the elements or "weathered" are gray and often covered with various

species of moss and lichens, a process that takes decades. "Raw" stone (i.e., covered by earth until now) stands out for years and should be used sparingly or not at all. On the other hand, some roadside walls get partly buried; it's OK to re-expose the stones. Sometimes one can use nearby stretches of a wall as a guide for height and style, whether mending an existing wall or building a new one where none exists.

FINANCIAL FOCUS® TERM VS. PERM: WHICH IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

If you've been thinking about life insurance, especially if you have family, loved ones, or anyone who depends on you financially, you might be curious about the different kinds of policies available. Which type is right for you?

Essentially, you can look at two main categories of life insurance: term and permanent.

Term insurance is a pay-as-you-go option that covers a specific amount of time, usually 20 years or fewer. Term insurance benefits are paid to your beneficiaries free of federal income taxes if you pass away during the coverage period, but there's no opportunity to build cash value.

Permanent insurance, such as whole life or universal life, offers coverage for as long as you pay the premiums, and in addition to providing a tax-free death benefit, also offers a chance to build equity, or cash value, on a tax-deferred basis.

When determining which type of insurance is appropriate for your needs, you'll want to consider these factors:

- Cost Term insurance is generally affordable for most people, which is why it may be particularly suitable for parents and young adults who may be at the beginning of their careers. Permanent insurance is typically more expensive, largely because it is meant to last for one's lifetime and some of the premiums go toward building cash value in the policy and paying for other features. Generally, the younger and healthier you are when you purchase permanent insurance, the lower your rates will be.
- Length of time insurance is needed If you think you will only need life insurance for a certain period perhaps until your children are grown you might lean toward term insurance. If you feel the need for life insurance for other goals throughout your lifetime, for whatever reason you might have a special needs child, or perhaps you want to use your policy to help pay for retirement, or you wish to include the policy as part of your legacy and estate plans you may want to consider some type of permanent insurance.
- Investment preferences You may have heard the phrase "buy term and invest the difference." Essentially, this just means that an investor could purchase low-cost term insurance, and then invest the money that was saved by not getting permanent insurance. This can be a valuable strategy in some situations, but people often don't actually invest the difference. A permanent insurance policy, through the payment of premiums, may result in a steady buildup of cash value or continued contributions to the policy's investment components. For many people, this discipline is helpful.
- Future insurability If you have health issues, it could become difficult to get permanent insurance after you've reached the end of a term insurance policy. (Some term insurance policies do offer the opportunity to convert to permanent coverage, usually without the need for a medical exam.) You could avoid this potential problem by purchasing permanent insurance when you are still young and healthy.

Ultimately, you will need to weigh the various factors involved in the permanent-versus-term decision. You also might benefit from consulting a financial professional, who can evaluate which type of insurance is most appropriate for your situation. But whether it's term or permanent, make sure you have the coverage you need to protect yourself and your loved ones.

HAVE YOU BEEN AFFECTED BY A DATA BREACH?

All too often, the news contains reports of data breaches. A data breach is when hackers break into the computers of a large corporation and steal their confidential information. In many cases the information that is stolen is confidential personal and financial data of their customers. Unfortunately, these customers can be you and me.

A few weeks ago, AT&T acknowledged a data breach in which hackers accessed 73 million former and current user accounts. Thieves had access to customer's name, email address, phone number, Social Security number, AT&T account number, and passcode. (The passcode is the 4-digit PIN needed to access your account.) The breach happened in 2019. You were unaffected if you opened your AT&T account in 2020 or later. AT&T has contacted 7.3 million CURRENT customers who were affected and reset their passcode. If you are notified, you should log in, check your user profile, and establish a new passcode.

Often companies who have suffered breaches will offer credit monitoring services at their cost for some period. It is strongly urged that you accept that offer and sign up for such services. The company will provide detailed instructions. Experian offers a service for a fee. Other credit bureaus may also offer plans. Another option is to freeze your credit. This prevents any new credit accounts or loans from being initiated. These are fine but be aware that it would inhibit you from initiating a home mortgage, car loan, or new credit card request too. You can always call and cancel the credit freeze if you need to apply for credit. A Fraud alert is also an option. Both credit freezes and fraud alerts need to be placed with each credit reporting company. Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. If you feel that your credit or debit card numbers are compromised, call your bank, and request new cards. Data breaches are out of your control. However, hackers are constantly developing new ways to fool us into giving away private financial information. The same steps listed above should be considered if you have accidentally provided such information over the phone.




