

TYNGSBOROUGH'S TOWN MANAGER REPORT From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager <u>May 2024</u>

I am pleased to report the following information from Town over the last month. You can find a full version of the Town Manager's report online at tyngsboroughma.gov.

• The Town of Tyngsborough was awarded a \$25,000 earmark for electric vehicle infrastructure for public safety and is exploring ways to utilize this funding to jump start the purchase of an electric police vehicle.

The Annual Town Election will take place on May 21, 2024
from 7 AM to 8 PM. Learn more and find out where to vote at tyngsboroughma.gov under the "Elections and Voting" page.
The hazardous material abatement on the Winslow School was completed in April. This project included the removal and abatement of hazardous material include asbestos and lead. The design work on the \$1.5M partial demolition and exterior restoration of the original school house is nearing completion and the Select Board will consider future steps at a meeting in May or June.

Design of the new pre-engineered steel building that will house the Department of Public Works on the site of the current highway garage kicked off in April. We expect the design phase to continue through June. This project is funded by a mix of capital funding allocated at Town Meeting and funding from the Sewer Commission.
The Select Board hosted a Tri-Board meeting on April 8th with the Finance Committee and School Committee as well as State Senator Ed Kennedy and State Representative Colleen Garry. The meeting provided an overview on the Town's legislative priorities, a call for an increase in state aid, and an update on the Town's financial position.

• The Yard Waste Drop Off Site is open for the season. Residents can access the site from Bryant Lane and the site will remain open now through December. Please visit the trash and recycling page of tyngsboroughma.gov to learn more about rules and hours of operation.





YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO MAKE YOUR **OWN HEALTH DECISIONS** By Edward H. Adamsky

Every person in America has the right to make their own health decisions. Doctors and other medical professionals can suggest treatments that they think you should have, but only you get to decide if you want to accept that treatment or not. No one else gets to make the decision except you. You have the right to choose. You can say "Yes" to treatments you want. You can say "No" to any treatment that you don't want - even if the treatment might keep you alive longer.

Your doctor should tell you about your medical condition and the treatment alternatives available. Many treatments have "side effects." Your doctor must offer you information about problems that medical treatment is likely to cause you. Often, more than one treatment might help you - and people have different ideas about which is best. Your doctor can tell you which treatments are available to you, but your doctor can't choose for you. That choice is yours to make and depends on what is important to you.

You can ask others for help in making the decision. You might want to consult with your family, with a religious advisor, or with another medical professional. You can get information from books, online, and from other medical professionals. But, in the end, you will make the final decision.

If you are not able to make your own decisions, because you are unconscious. or are unable to communicate your choices. then no one else can make your decisions for you, unless you have authorized them to do so in writing. This can be done by signing a Medical Directive or Health Care Proxy in advance. With that document you grant permission to a person of your choosing to make those future medical decisions for you if and when you cannot. You can also provide some written guidance regarding your wishes.

In many states you can sign, and also have your doctor sign, a Medical Order for Life Sustaining Treatment. This can specify your wishes for some typical treatments like CPR, intubation, and dialysis. You can say that you do or do not want any of these treatments. With your doctor's signature on this form, other medical professionals will follow those wishes.

After you choose an agent, and before you finalize that decision in writing, you should talk to that person about what you want. Sometimes treatment decisions are hard to make, and it truly helps if your agent knows what you want. You should have a frank discussion about life and death, and quality of life in regard to medical care. You want your agent to make the same decision that you would.

You can always change your mind and sign a new Directive or Proxy naming a different person as your Agent, or have the written order by your doctor changed or discarded. You are always in charge of your own medical decisions. Consult with your Elder Law Attorney about getting a Health Care Proxy in place.

SENIOR CIRCUIT BREAKER TAX CREDIT

As a senior citizen (65 or older), you may be eligible to claim a refundable credit on your Massachusetts personal income tax return. The Circuit Breaker tax credit is based on the actual real estate taxes or rent paid on residential property you own or rent and occupy as your principal residence. This credit is available even if your income level does not require you to file a Massachusetts income tax return.

The maximum credit amount for tax year 2023 is \$2,590.

- · Applicants must meet income guidelines.
- Homeowners: Property value limit is \$1,025,000 and your

property taxes together with half of your water and sewer expense, must exceed 10% of your total Massachusetts income for the tax year.

• Renters: 25% of your annual rent must exceed 10% of your total income for the tax year.

Helpsy - saving us \$ as they

help save the planet

Did you know that your worn-out, wrong-sized, or otherwise unwanted clothing, shoes and other textiles are not trash? No matter their condition, they have more life in them. Helpsy, the company that collects our textiles, has a mission to keep textiles out of the trash, saving towns money, providing jobs and helping the environment.

Here's how they do it. They have a collection plant in Woburn, MA that operates 24/7. Trucks pick up clothing from recycle bins as well as curbsides across the state. It's admirable to learn that 95% of what Helpsy collects is reused or recycled. Higher grades of clothing, shoes and other textiles are resold to thrift stores in North America and other second-hand markets around the world, while lower grade materials are repurposed into rags for industrial use or stuffing and insulation.

Recycling and reusing has an environmental impact. Altogether, Helpsy is repurposing 100 items per minute. As of today, Helpsy has kept 31 million pounds of clothing, shoes and other items out of the waste stream and because these items have been repurposed, a total of six billion gallons of water and nearly 207 million pounds of CO2 emissions were saved from new clothing creations.

There is a financial benefit to towns recycling textiles. Serving 48 municipalities, Helpsy has helped these cities and towns save more than \$1.3 million in waste disposal tipping fees. In addition to these savings, Helpsy pays Tyngsborough for materials collected. Helpsy has paid more than \$500,000 to municipalities and charities. The Sustainability Committee receives a quarterly report from Helpsy, telling us the weight of the materials they have collected. Helpsy has collected more than 5,000 pounds of textiles in Tyngsborough over this past year.

Recycling textiles also brings jobs to the area. Helpsy prides themselves on paying the best wages in the industry and their workforce is diverse. Each employee earns a living wage and is a shareholder in the company. Helpsy's operations support thousands of full-time jobs at Helpsy and their customers.

FINANCIAL FOCUS® TERM VS. PERM: WHICH IS RIGHT FOR YOU?

If you've been thinking about life insurance, especially if you have family, loved ones, or anyone who depends on you financially, you might be curious about the different kinds of policies available. Which type is right for you?

Essentially, you can look at two main categories of life insurance: term and permanent.

Term insurance is a pay-as-you-go option that covers a specific amount of time, usually 20 years or fewer. Term insurance benefits are paid to your beneficiaries free of federal income taxes if you pass away during the coverage period, but there's no opportunity to build cash value.

Permanent insurance, such as whole life or universal life, offers coverage for as long as you pay the premiums, and in addition to providing a tax-free death benefit, also offers a chance to build equity, or cash value, on a tax-deferred basis.

When determining which type of insurance is appropriate for your needs, you'll want to consider these factors:

• Cost – Term insurance is generally affordable for most people, which is why it may be particularly suitable for parents and young adults who may be at the beginning of their careers. Permanent insurance is typically more expensive, largely because it is meant to last for one's lifetime and some of the premiums go toward building cash value in the policy and paying for other features. Generally, the younger and healthier you are when you purchase permanent insurance, the lower your rates will be.

• Length of time insurance is needed – If you think you will only need life insurance for a certain period - perhaps until your children are grown — you might lean toward term insurance. If you feel the need for life insurance for other goals throughout your lifetime, for whatever reason - you might have a special needs child, or perhaps you want to use your policy to help pay for retirement, or you wish to include the policy as part of your legacy and estate plans - you may want to consider some type of permanent insurance.

• Investment preferences – You may have heard the phrase "buy term and invest the difference." Essentially, this just means that an investor could purchase low-cost term insurance, and then invest the money that was saved by not getting permanent insurance. This can be a valuable strategy in some situations, but people often don't actually invest the difference. A permanent insurance policy, through the payment of premiums, may result in a steady buildup of cash value or continued contributions to the policy's investment components. For many people, this discipline is helpful.

• Future insurability - If you have health issues, it could become difficult to get permanent insurance after you've reached the end of a term insurance policy. (Some term insurance policies do offer the opportunity to convert to permanent coverage, usually without the need for a medical exam.) You could avoid this potential problem by purchasing permanent insurance when you are still young and healthy.

Ultimately, you will need to weigh the various factors involved in the permanent-versus-term decision. You also might benefit from consulting a financial professional, who can evaluate which type of insurance is most appropriate for your situation. But whether it's term or permanent, make sure you have the coverage you need to protect yourself and your loved ones.

HAVE YOU BEEN AFFECTED BY A DATA BREACH? By Dean Lotito

All too often, the news contains reports of data breaches. A data breach is when hackers break into the computers of a large corporation and steal their confidential information. In many cases the information that is stolen is confidential personal and financial data of their customers. Unfortunately, these customers can be you and me.

A few weeks ago, AT&T acknowledged a data breach in which hackers accessed 73 million former and current user accounts. Thieves had access to customer's name, email address, phone number, Social Security number, AT&T account number, and passcode. (The passcode is the 4-digit PIN needed to access your account.) The breach happened in 2019. You were unaffected if you opened your AT&T account in 2020 or later. AT&T has contacted 7.3 million CURRENT customers who were affected and reset their passcode. If you are notified, you should log in, check your user profile, and establish a new passcode.

Often companies who have suffered breaches will offer credit monitoring services at their cost for some period. It is strongly urged that you accept that offer and sign up for such services. The company will provide detailed instructions. Experian offers a service for a fee. Other credit bureaus may also offer plans. Another option is to freeze your credit. This prevents any new credit accounts or loans from being initiated. These are fine but be aware that it would inhibit you from initiating a home mortgage, car loan, or new credit card request too. You can always call and cancel the credit freeze if you need to apply for credit. A Fraud alert is also an option. Both credit freezes and fraud alerts need to be placed with each credit reporting company. Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion. If you feel that your credit or debit card numbers are compromised, call your bank, and request new cards. Data breaches are out of your control. However, hackers are constantly developing new ways to fool us into giving away private financial information. The same steps listed above should be considered if you have accidentally provided such information over the phone.




