STONE WALLS AND SCENIC ROADS

Refer to Massachusetts General Laws, Title VII, Chapter 40, Section 15C: Scenic road designations; improvements; fines: https://malegislature.gov/Laws/GeneralLaws/Partl/TitleVII/Chapter40/Section15C

The stone walls lining many roads and tracing through the woods and fields of Dunstable date mostly from the 18th and 19th centuries. They were built to get rid of stones from our glacier-impacted soils and were used for controlling livestock and, increasingly, as boundary markers. (A split rail fence – one rail set upon crossed fence posts – might be added, supplemented, or replaced by barbed wire after the 1870s.)

Although at first glance the stone walls may appear to some people to be just a pile of rocks, in keeping with a single theme throughout the town, it is important that we maintain their appearance.

These walls have historical and aesthetic value and are legally protected in some locations. One may not alter a "bound wall" – one that forms a boundary between two separately owned properties. In Dunstable and many other towns, walls bordering roads designated as "scenic" by Town Meeting may not be breached, significantly altered, or demolished without permission from the Planning Board after a public hearing. (Refer to the Town's General Bylaws, and subsection "SCENIC ROAD BYLAW" for a listing of designated scenic roads.) Breaching a wall – most often to accommodate a new driveway – is rather straightforward but does require a permit. Repairing or reconstructing a wall involves several considerations.

Stone walls have two natural enemies: vegetation and gravity. Dunstable farmers created stone walls and had to maintain them (sometimes called "mending walls.") This typically simply meant restoring to their place stones which had fallen or rebuilding a collapsed portion. Such repair is certainly permitted by the Town's Scenic Roads Bylaw. (Note: Dunstable's historic walls were always "dry" – NO mortar should ever be used in repairing them.) Adding new stones to a wall is another matter. Stones exposed to the elements or "weathered" are gray and often covered with various

species of moss and lichens, a process that takes decades. "Raw" stone (i.e., covered by earth until now) stands out for years and should be used sparingly or not at all. On the other hand, some roadside walls get partly buried; it's OK to re-expose the stones. Sometimes one can use nearby stretches of a wall as a guide for height and style, whether mending an existing wall or building a new one where none exists.

The Board of Health just renewed their contract with F. W. Shaw & Son for another 3 years. Their bid prices are very so it will allow the Board of Health to again offer a reasonable subscription price for this year. The fee will remain at \$360.00. Overflow bag prices also remain the same at \$3.00 each in rolls of five for \$15.00.

Bulky item prices have increased (please see attached) however, the Board is excited to announce a new program available beginning July 1st to all Dunstable residents for the disposal of mat-We have partnered with UTEC (United Team Equality Center) a nonprofit entity, to offer the disposal of mattresses for \$40.00 each. Mattresses will be picked up curbside monthly on a Tuesday by appointment. Part of the proceeds will go to helping youth at risk. To reserve a pickup please use one of these options. The Board would also like to thank all who continue to use the recycling boxes located on Pleasant Street. These boxes have allowed hundreds of tons of recycling materials to be diverted from the waste stream and converted into reusable items.

The Board of Health has adopted a new regulation to impose a one-month late fee (\$30.00) to all existing subscribers whose payment is not received by June 30th

Beginning May 1, three renewal options are available.

- 1. You may pay on line on the town webpage www.dunstable-ma.gov and choose online payments. Scroll down halfway to Trash-Board of Health. New subscribers can use the same options.
- 2. You may mail a \$360.00 check made payable to the Town of Dunstable to P.O. Box 268, Dunstable, MA 01827. Please include your name, address, phone number and email address.
- 3. You may drop off a check or cash at the Town Hall Monday-Thursday (upper level) 9:00-4:00 p.m. Please write Joan – Trash Payment on your envelope. Please make sure your name, address, phone number and email address are included. You may also drop the payment in the outside mailbox of the town hall located by the side door

Overflow bags can also be purchased online or at the town hall for those times you may have extra trash that will not fit into the trash container. The cost is \$3.00 each, sold in rolls of five for \$15.00. Bags may be picked up at the town hall Monday-Thursday 9:00 a.m.- 4:00 p.m. Bring a copy of your receipt if you pay online.

SOCIAL SECURITY SURVIVOR'S BENEFITS

Even before the first Social Security check was issued in 1940, Congress was making changes to the program. They created benefits for the widow of a retired worker so she would continue to get benefits for the rest of her lifetime. The eligibility rules for survivors have improved over time; they are gender neutral; they include same-sex relationships; and the age requirement is lower.

One thing that hasn't changed is confusion over survivor's benefits and how to claim them. If your spouse has died, you may be eligible to receive Social Security Benefits on your late spouse's record. How much you get depends on your age, your own Social Security benefits record, and whether there are dependent children. Your own record might be better though, so you have to consider your options.

You can receive survivor benefits if you are 50 and have a disability, are 60 (although at a reduced benefit amount), or at any age if you have children under 16 (this list isn't exhaustive). If you are eligible for benefits but haven't applied yet, you can apply for either retirement or survivors benefits first and later you can switch to a higher benefit, if that later applies.

You need to know your Full Retirement Age (FRA) for any benefits decision. For most people today that is something over age 66. You have to look up the chart at the Social Security Website to find out for sure. If you have not reached your FRA then your benefits will be reduced, generally for as long as you get them, so it is often better to wait until you reach your FRA. The best way to find out which benefit is higher and better is to contact the Social Security Administration. The system is very complicated, and you want the best advice possible.

The first place to start is on the Social Security Website – www.ssa.gov – you can find out a lot of good information there. Then you will probably have to call the SSA to schedule an appointment to apply in person. There are some document requirements so you will want to know those and get everything you need in advance. You can sometimes go to a local SSA office in person with or without an appointment, but it's better to schedule an appointment in advance.

One great new benefit of technological advances is that now the SSA is offering video appointments that you can do from home or wherever you have an internet connection. This is especially valuable for people who have trouble traveling to an appointment (which includes many seniors). You will need a computer or smartphone with internet access, a camera function, and an email account. Then you can call SSA at 1-800-772-1213 from 8 AM to 7 PM Monday through Friday and schedule a video appointment. If video won't work for you, you can still have a telephone or in-person appointment, if necessary.



Follow Jesus by Eric Paquette

A sign in a restaurant reads, "If our food, drinks and services aren't up to your standards, please lower your standards." That sign, humorous or not, reminds me why the world needs Jesus so much. He refuses to allow us to become content with low living. He calls us to follow Him and by so doing become all God can make us to be. Mark 1: 17, records Jesus' challenge to Peter and Andrew, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." Some of the best news in the gospel is found in the simple words of that call given so long ago, "Follow Me, and I will make you become." These are hopeful words, for they assure us of the possibility of change. If my life is not what it should be or what I know God wants it to be, I can, with God's power and grace, become more like He wants me to be! Peter and Andrew were fishing for fish but God wanted them to fish for the souls of men!

In the 1920's, a man by the name of Mallory repeatedly sought to scale Mt. Everest. The first attempt failed, as did the second. A third attempt was make with a team of the best quality and ability. In spite of careful planning and extensive safety precautions, on the third attempt an avalanche hit and Mallory and most of his party were killed. When the few who survived returned to England, a great banquet was held to honor the adventurous souls of Mallory's final expedition. As the leader of the survivors stood to acknowledge the applause, he looked around the banquet hall at framed pictures of those who had died. Then he turned his back to the crowd to face a huge picture of Mt. Everest which loomed like a silent, unconquerable giant behind the head banquet table. With tears streaming down his face, he addressed the mountain on behalf of Mallory and his dead comrades. "I speak to you, Mt. Everest, in the name of all brave men living and those yet unborn. Mt. 

(If you remarry before age 60, you typically cannot receive survivor benefits, but you can reinstate them if this subsequent marriage ends.) The amount of your survivor's benefits depends on your age and the age of your deceased spouse. You can't claim your deceased spouse's benefits along with your own retirement benefits, so if you qualify for survivor and retirement benefits, you'll receive the larger amount. Depending on your situation, you might come out ahead by delaying your retirement benefits, giving them the chance to grow, while you accept survivor benefits. - Review your estate plans. The death of a spouse can certainly affect your family's estate plans. So, it's a good idea to review these plans to see what changes, if any, need to be made. When conducting this review, you'll benefit from working with an estate-planning professional.

Finally, keep in mind that you don't have to go it alone during this difficult time. If you're already working with a financial professional, they can help. If you aren't currently working with one, now might be the time to start. WI-FI VS. MOBILE DATA By Dean Lotito

I still get asked the difference between Wi-Fi and Mobile Data (also called cell data). This is important to people that have cell phone plans with a monthly limit for data. If the user exceeds that limit additional charges will be added to your bill. Understanding how to limit those charges is important.

A cell phone signal is broadcast from cell phone towers that were built by the companies you pay for your cell phone. Even if your cell service includes unlimited data each month it is important to understand how Wi-Fi is different than Cell data. The main advantage of cell data is coverage. Cell phone towers cover a huge portion of the US. Another advantage is that it is a secure private connection suitable for bank transactions. These two features are why we all pay for cell phones.

Wi-Fi data is what we have in our homes and public buildings. This signal cannot reach very far, but it is significantly faster than a cell signal. It is also basically free. In your home, the internet service you buy provides a Wi-Fi signal for your use. In public buildings, the town or store owner provides the Wi-Fi service for free. Many airlines often charge a fee for Wi-Fi access during flights, but Wi-Fi at the airport is usually free.

Phone plans with a limit on data are specifically limiting cell or Mobil Data. Wi-Fi data does not affect that limit. You can always use unlimited Wi-Fi data with no additional charge from your cell phone provider.

The security of a Wi-Fi connection is something to be aware of. Your Wi-Fi signal at home is encrypted and password protected. It should be using WPA2 encryption. However public Wi-Fi networks are open and should not be used to communicate with financial institutions unless it is an emergency.

When you are making a phone call, your phone will always try to use the cell phone network. However, there is now a feature on most phones to enable "Wi-Fi Calling." When enabled, the phone will route the call through your Wi-Fi network. Wi-Fi Calling is useful when you are in a building or home that has poor cell reception, giving you more reliable phone connections. Be aware that if you are in a building with a poor Wi-Fi connection, Wi-Fi Calling may not work well.
