TYNGSBOROUGH'S TOWN MANAGER REPORT

From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager

<u>July 2024</u>

I am pleased to report the following information from Town over the last month. You can find a full version of the Town Manager's report online at tyngsboroughma.gov.

Congratulations to the Tyngsborough High School, Academy of Notre Dame, Innovation Academy, and Greater Lowell Technical High School classes of 2024. Best wishes as you all move on to the next phase of your life.

The Town of Tyngsborough was awarded a \$157,000 grant from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts to expand our municipal fiber network across the bridge. This will help us connect the new clubhouse on the Sherburne Road parcel to the Town's fiber and will leave fiber available at the Norris Road campus of the Tyngsborough Public Schools so that they can connect when they want to.

A reminder that the Tyngsborough recreation department will host the 2024 Party by the Bridge on August 24, 2024. The day will begin at 11:00 AM and will run all day, closing with fireworks over the river at dark! Visit partybythebridge.com to learn more!

The Tyngsborough Board of Health is planning a vigil in September as a part of National Opioid Awareness Day. As a part of these regional efforts, the Board of Health has also purchased Narcan for distribution and is working to schedule community training for administering the Narcan.

Work continues this summer on the 2024 Road Project. Phase I includes preservation treatment on various streets on both sides of the river and Phase II includes a full-depth reclamation of Oregon and Nevada. In total, the 2024 roads project will touch 3.16 miles of road and cost just shy of \$1.5M.

Finally, the Town Manager's Office and Tyngsborough Media will be launching Tyngsborough's first Citizens Academy this fall. This six-week program will offer an in-depth look at how local government operates to help better engage the community. More information will be forthcoming and available at tyngsboroughma. gov.

Where Does the Money for Tyngsboro's Waste Reduction Programs Come From?

SMRP, RDP, MassDEP, WTE... What does that all mean? It's not trendy new slang kids are using these days. However, these acronyms are still pretty great.

TL, DR*: The State financially rewards municipalities that take on waste reduction projects with funds that can be used to continue to invest in waste reduction. The funding comes from the private sector - not tax levy - and helps to reduce some of the financial burden of trash and recycling programs on cities and towns.

The Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection (MassDEP) Recycling Dividends Program (RDP) supports projects aimed at reducing pollution and improving environmental quality. The funding for the overall program comes from an agreement between the State and the five trash incinerators that operate in Massachusetts. The Sustainable Materials Recovery Program (SMRP) was created by the Green Communities Act of 2008, which required a portion of state proceeds from the sale of Waste-to-Energy (WTE) Credits to be directed to waste reduction programs. RDP is just one category of grants under the SMRP umbrella. Tyngsborough has participated in RDP since its inception.

These grants can be used by municipalities, businesses, and nonprofits for initiatives such as recycling programs, pollution prevention efforts, and environmental education campaigns. The program provides financial assistance to encourage innovative solutions to environmental challenges across the state.

It's a nice feedback loop: Tyngsboro offers a program like Zero Waste Day, then the State provides funding for more programs, Tyngsboro can then offer Food Waste drop-off collection at the DPW Recycling Center, whereupon the State rewards Tyngsboro with more funding. And on and on it goes! So the next time you participate in string lights collection, visit the new DPW Recycling Center, stop by a Repair Cafe or Hazardous Waste Day, or purchase a home composting bin, you are helping Tyngsboro to engage and invest in waste reduction programs. Waste Reduction Updates

We had another successful Zero Waste Day last May, collecting more than 16,000 pounds of scrap metal, bikes, small engines, textiles, books, electronics, furniture, and other household goods, all of which will be put to reuse or recycled. Nice job!

Our food waste collection is going well. Many of you are bringing your food scraps to the collection totes at the DPW. This is saving the town money on tipping fees (we pay per pound of trash brought to the incinerators) and all these scraps are being composted into rich soil. Thank you for either dumping your food scraps directly into the bin or in BPI, CMA or OK certified compostable plastic bags. And thank you for removing produce stickers.





SOCIAL SECURITY'S REPRESENTATIVE PAYMENT PROGRAM

Most everyone manages their own Social Security benefits. You get your payment deposited into your bank account each month, and then you spend the money as you wish. If you want to change where the money is deposited, you call the SSA or go online to make a change. But if a person is unable to handle these tasks, the Social Security Administration (SSA) does not recognize Powers of Attorney nor Guardianships for their system and so requires some person (or Agency) to be appointed, as a **Representative Payee**, to manage the benefits for that individual. The Representative Payee is responsible for maintaining a separate bank account where the benefit payments will be deposited and must account each year (on a relatively simple form) for the funds received and spent. The form can be filled out and submitted on paper, or it can be done online at SSA.gov. This system allows the SSA to monitor and make sure that a Representative Payee is doing the job properly.

Sometimes it is not absolutely necessary to have a Representative Payee. If an elder, for instance, has a valid Power of Attorney that lets their named agent have access to their bank account, then the Agent can use the money in the account for the benefit of the Elder without need to be officially appointed as a Representative Payee. Of course, the Agent under the Power of Attorney will have no ability to contact the SSA about payments, nor would the Agent have the ability to change where the payments are going. But, if the Agent doesn't need to do these things, then the Agent has legal access to the funds and doesn't have to be a Representative Payee with the responsibility that entails.

If someone tells you that you need to apply to be a representative payee, you should consult with an Elder Law Attorney to make sure that is so. In some cases, it is necessary and in other cases you can get by without doing so. If you have been appointed as a Representative Payee, then you should open a separate bank account where the funds will be deposited, and you should keep clean and clear records of how you spend the money. It may be spent in any fashion to benefit the person whose is getting the payments, but you will have to document where and how you spent it. As long as you keep good records and don't use the money in a way that isn't allowed, you shouldn't have any problem. But sometimes people get appointed in a hurry and don't understand the system and don't keep good records.

If you have questions about handling assets for another person and dealing with their income, you should contact your local Elder Law Attorney to learn how things should be done and whether or not it is necessary to apply to be a Representative Payee.



WATER SAFETY

Before going in, on or around the water, every family member should become "water smart." This starts with learning to be safe, making good choices, and learning to swim to at least achieve the skills of water competency. Everyone should be able to enter the water, get a breath, stay afloat, change position, swim a distance and then get out of the water safely. A variety of water safety courses and resources are available to help.

To help keep your family safe, the Red Cross offers these tips:

- 1. Prevent unsupervised access to water. Fence pools and spas with adequate barriers and keep a constant eye for any water dangers such as portable splash pools/slides, buckets and bathtubs.
- Adults should actively supervise children and stay within arm's reach of young children and new swimmers. Kids should follow the rules.
- **3.** Designate a "water watcher" to keep a close eye and constant attention on children and weaker swimmers in and around the water until the next water watcher takes over.
- 4. Always wear a properly fitted U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket when on a boat and if in a situation beyond someone's skill level.
- **5**. Swim as a pair near a lifeguard's chair everyone, including experienced swimmers, should swim with a buddy even in areas supervised by lifeguards.
- **6.** Always maintain constant attention and actively supervise children even when lifeguards are present.



How strong is your emergency fund?

You can't predict financial emergencies — but you can prepare for them.

To do that, you can build an emergency fund to pay for unexpected expenses, some of which may be sizable. Without one, you might be forced to dip into your investments, possibly including your retirement accounts, such as your IRA or 401(k). If this happens, you might have to pay taxes and penalties, and you'd be withdrawing dollars that could otherwise be growing over time to help pay for your retirement.

- In thinking about such a fund, consider these questions:
 How much should I save? The size of your emergency fund should be based on several factors, including your income, your spouse's income and your cost of living. However, for most people in their working years, three to six months of total expenses is adequate. Once you're retired, though, you may want to keep up to a year's worth of expenses in your emergency fund — because you don't want to be forced to cash out investments when their price may be down, and you may not be replenishing these accounts any longer.
- How can I build an emergency fund? Given all your normal expenses — mortgage, utilities, food, transportation and others you might find it challenging to set aside some extra money in an emergency fund. But you do have opportunities. If you're working, you could set up a direct deposit so that part of your paycheck goes directly into your emergency fund. You could also save a portion of any extra income you receive, such as bonuses and tax refunds.
- Where should I keep the money? An emergency fund has two key requirements: You need to be able to access the money immediately and you need to count on a certain amount being available. So, it's a good idea to keep your emergency fund in a liquid, low-risk account that offers protection of principal. For this fund, you're less interested in growth than you are in stability. But because interest rates have recently changed, you may be able to get a reasonable return without sacrificing liquidity or safety.
- · What types of emergencies should I prepare for? Your emergency fund could be needed for any number of events: a job loss or early retirement, housing or auto repairs, unreimbursed medical bills, unexpected travel, and so on. But this fund may also be needed to help you cope with other threats. Consider this: In 2023, the U.S. saw a record 28 weather and climate disasters, each of which resulted in at least \$1 billion in damages — and often many times this amount — according to the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration. Depending on where you live, your home or business may be susceptible to tornadoes, floods, wildfires, hurricanes and extreme heat and cold waves. These events can, and do, result in property repair and relocation costs, higher insurance premiums and even price increases for basic goods, such as groceries and prescription medications.

One final word about an emergency fund: It takes discipline to maintain it and to avoid tapping into it for everyday expenses or impulse purchases. The name says it all — this is a fund that should only be used for emergencies. By keeping it intact until it's truly needed, you can help yourself weather many of the storms that may come your


