

TYNGSBOROUGH'S TOWN MANAGER REPORT From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager October 2024

I am pleased to report the following information from Town over the last month. You can find a full version of the Town Manager's report online at tyngsboroughma.gov.

• Work on our new pedestrian bridge in the Town Center was completed in September. The work was funded by a mix of Community Preservation Funds and a grant from the Commonwealth. The work saw the installation of a pedestrian bridge over Flint Pond, the installation of a new ADA accessible walkway connecting Winslow Road to Middlesex, as well as various site improvements which have made that space much more useable for large events like Festival of Trees and Block Party.

• Work commenced this summer on the new recreation site located on the former Tyngsborough Country Club. We expect most of the work to be completed this fall with finishing touches being done this Spring. When complete, the site will include pickleball courts, basketball courts, a pitch and putt, bocce courts, and so much more. This project has been funded entirely by CPC funds.

• The Engineering Division of our DPW was hard at work this summer with the 2024 Roads Project which saw preservation work on the East side of the bridge and a full-depth reclamation in the state's neighborhood on the west side.

• Town staff have been hard at work over the summer getting grants from various state and federal agencies to supplement the operating budget. Some highlights below:

* Department of Public Works - \$326,500 to design the replacement of a failing culvert

* Information Technology - \$99,000 to develop a cyber security incident response plan

 * Information Technology - 156,741 to expand the Town's fiber network

* Police Department - \$19,407 to replace the digital fingerprint scanner

The Town will host a Special Town Meeting on October 22 at the Tyngsborough Elementary School at 7 PM. Residents can attend a Pre-Town Meeting information session on Tuesday, October 15 at 6PM in the Community Room at Town Hall. More information can be found at <u>www.tyngsboroughma.gov</u>.

SENIOR TAX WORK OFF PROGRAM - 2025

The senior tax work-off program is a way for seniors to work at various jobs throughout the town to earn up to \$1,500 off of their property tax bill.

To be eligible, you must be age 60 as of 7/1/2024, own your home and have resided in Tyngsborough for at least 5 years and have gross income less that \$40,000 if single and \$60,000 if married for calendar year 2023. Work must be completed between January 1st and October 31st 2025. *Applications will be available beginning October 3, 2024* at the Council on Aging, Library, and Town Hall (Assessor's Office and Town Manager's Office) for the 2025 - FY2026 program. Applications are due to the Assessor's Office by November 7, 2024. If you have questions about the program, contact the Assessor's Office at 978-64-2300 x 121.

2024 Dog Licenses are available at the Town Clerk's office or by mail. The license is now late and payment must include a \$25.00 late fee. Male/female licenses are \$11.00 and spayed/neutered licenses are \$7.00. Current rabies vaccination is required. If renewing by mail, please enclose a stamped envelope for the license.
 Late Fee is waived for all NEW dog registrations.
 STATE ELECTION: State Election is November 5th Voting hours 7:00 am to 8:00 pm at the Elementary School and the Middle School. Deadline to register to vote in the State Election is October 26th. Town Hall will be open from 9am to 5pm to accept any last-minute registrations.

• ÉARLY VOTING: State Election Early voting will start October 19th through October 31st. Early voting will be held at Town Hall. Hours for early voting will be posted on the town website.

TYNGSBOROUGH'S YARD WASTE DROP-OFF SITE

The Residential Yard Waste Drop Off Site is located across the street from Town Hall, 25 Bryants Lane, closer to the Middlesex Road end. Use of this Yard Waste Drop-Off Site is available to residents only, is free and usage is unlimited during operating hours. Vehicles will enter & exit through the same driveway. Look for the signage on Bryants Lane. Open Tuesday through Friday 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM, Saturday 8:30 AM - 3:30 PM. Please note that the Town will close the site during heavy rain events or snow events. Notices about changes of hours due to weather events will be posted on the Town website & social media.

Yard waste may be dumped from any type of container or left in paper leaf bags. No items should be left in anything other than paper bags. If transporting the yard waste via plastic bag or barrel, please dump directly onto the ground. Signs will point you to where to leave the yard waste. Your cooperation in keeping the site orderly is appreciated.

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT

• When's the Medicare Open Enrollment Period? Every year, Medicare's open enrollment period is <u>October 15 - December 7</u>. What's the Medicare Open Enrollment Period? Medicare health and drug plans can make changes each year—things like cost, coverage, and what providers and pharmacies are in their networks. October 15 to December 7 is when all people with Medicare can change their Medicare health plans and prescription drug coverage for the following year to better meet their needs.

• How do people know if they need to change plans? People in a Medicare health or prescription drug plan should always review the materials their plans send them, like the "Evidence of Coverage" (EOC) and "Annual Notice of Change" (ANOC). If their plans are changing, they should make sure their plans will still meet their needs for the following year. If they're satisfied that their current plans will meet their needs for next year and it's still being offered, they don't need to do anything.

• When can people get information about next year's Medicare plans? Information for next year's plans will be available beginning in October.

• Where can people find Medicare plan information or compare plans? 1-800-MEDICARE or <u>Medicare.gov</u>.

LOVE IS PATIENT

I don't think it is an overstatement to say that all Christians are familiar with the content in 1 Corinthians 13. We commonly refer to it as the chapter on love.

That is the subject Paul speaks on in this chapter. He wanted to show the Corinthians a "more excellent way" (12:31). Although he encouraged them to seek spiritual gifts, his desire for them was to develop the greatest gift of all — love.

How would you define love? Is it a feeling? Is it romance, as in boy meets girl, boy dates girl, boy marries girl? Is it natural affection? It is these things to be sure, but the love Paul speaks of here goes beyond mere feelings and emotions. The love the apostle writes about is a state of mind that manifests itself in how it behaves toward others. In verses four though eight, Paul describes how love behaves. The first thing he says about it is that love is patient.

Patience is probably one of the most difficult virtues for human beings to practice. We don't like to wait for anything. I ordered a small coffee the other morning at McDonalds and had to wait over 10 minutes to receive it because it was busy, and the staff was scrambling to prepare all the orders. Our patience is sorely tested late in the day when we're stuck in traffic, trying to make it home.

Practicing patience in circumstances like these is hard enough, but practicing it towards other people, including our brethren sometimes, is doubly hard. I believe this is what Paul is getting at.

When he speaks of love being patient, he is talking about patience with each other. It is the opposite of being quick tempered. It is a godlike quality, for God Himself exercises patience towards us. "The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance." (2 Peter 3:9 ESV).

In the parable of the unmerciful servant (Matthew 18:23–35), the slave pleads with his master, "Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything." Feeling compassion for the man, the master forgave him the debt. But that servant went out and demanded another who owed him to pay up, and when the man similarly pleaded for patience, the servant was unwilling to extend the same measure of mercy to his fellow slave. Enraged, the master cast the worthless slave into prison until he should repay everything.

Paul exhorts Christians in their walk with the Lord to exercise humility, gentleness, and patience, "bearing with one another in love," (Eph.4:2). Conflicts naturally arise between us sometimes. We're all at different levels of understanding and growth. Some are inclined towards optimism, others towards pessimism. We are not a one "size-fits-all" congregation; none exists. Each of us must "fit in" with each other by striving to be like God, showing patience and forbearance with one another, working together to build up the body.

MASSACHUSETTS PASSES BILL TO IMPROVE LONG TERM CARE By Edward H. Adamsky

On Friday, September 6, 2024, the Governor of Massachusetts signed a new Long Term Care Bill (H. 5033) that seeks to improve the quality and oversight of Long Term Care in Massachusetts. This bill covers nursing homes, assisted living facilities and skilled nursing facilities. The Massachusetts chapter of the National Academy of Elder Law Attorney (MassNAELA) advised members of the legislature and the governor on the problems and issues, and advocated for the creation and passage of this bill.

"The dedicated efforts of elder law advocates across the state have finally paid off with the passage and signing of the Long-Term Care Bill," said Clarence Richardson, MassNAELA Executive Director. "Several sections of this bill have been a top priority for MassNAELA and our partner groups as it's our goal to ensure the health and well-being of seniors and individuals with disabilities."

One of the important provisions of the bill allows seniors over the age of 65 to create and fund so-called Pooled Trusts which allow them to set aside some amount of money to provide for their needs before they run out of money and go on Medicaid benefits in a Long Term Care Facility. This was allowed previously but was eliminated with some recent changes to the Medicaid laws. The use of Pooled Trusts allows seniors to retain a small portion of their assets to pay for things that Medicaid and Medicare do not cover and preserves a certain level of dignity for those in a nursing home.

Certain funds are set aside by this Bill to provide for training and advocacy for nurses and aides working in the Long Term Care industry; to provide funding for innovative projects such as remodeling of facilities to allow for private rooms and additional housing for low-income residents; and training and education of supervisors and leaders of facilities.

The bill requires the government to engage in the process of reviewing all aspects of elder care including Nursing Homes, Rest Homes, and Assisted Living facilities. This greater level of oversight should ensure that everyone in the various types of care facilities is provided an adequate level of care and has a remedy if the facility does not provide proper care.

The bill also limits the Medicaid office's ability to seek Estate Recovery from the assets left behind by some Medicaid recipients. Federal law allows the state to seek repayment for Medicaid benefits from the assets left behind by most Medicaid recipients which can limit the ability of some families to provide for children and their families in their long-term planning. New limits on Estate Recovery will protect some low-income families from impoverishment.



FINANCIAL FOCUS[®] Saving for college? Or retirement?

If you're a parent, you want to do everything you can to help your children succeed in life. Therefore, you might think that one of the best things you can do is to save for your children's college education. And this is certainly admirable, but could it conflict with your ability to prepare for another key goal — your own retirement? Even with this focus on retirement, though, you may find opportunities to save and invest for your children's education. For example, if you receive bonuses or income tax refunds, or your salary goes up, or you're able to free up money from your budget by reducing your debts, you could use these funds to invest in an education savings vehicle, such as a 529 plan. When you invest in a 529 plan, your earnings and withdrawals are federally tax free, provided the money is used for qualified education expenses such as tuition, room and board, books, and computers. Depending on where you live, you may also get some state tax benefits from your 529 plan. And a 529 plan isn't just for college — it can be used for K-12 private school tuition costs, plus expenses from qualified apprenticeship programs, such as those found at trade schools eligible for Title IV federal student aid.

It might not be easy to save and invest consistently for your retirement and your children's education. But both goals are worthy — after all, retirement can last a long time and college is expensive. So, try to develop a financial strategy that can allow you to make progress in both areas — your efforts may well be rewarded.


