TYNGSBOROUGH'S TOWN MANAGER REPORT

From Colin Loiselle, Tyngsborough Town Manager
Novenmber 2024

I am pleased to report the following information from Town over the last month. You can find a full version of the Town Manager's report online at tyngsboroughma.gov.

In October we bid farewell to our Police Chief Richard Howe who retired after 29 years of service to the Town of Tyngsborough, with the last eleven as Chief. Town Administration spent much of September and early October working through a thorough search process to select the next Chief of Police.

In October we completed work on the Tyngsborough Police Parking Lot project which was a long overdue project that saw a resurfacing and reorganization of the lot to make it safer and more accessible. This project was funded as a part of the FY2024 Capital Plan.

In September we welcomed our new Town Planner & Economic Development Director Benjamin McClure to Town Hall. Ben is from the area and very familiar with Tyngsborough and our successes. Ben will be spending a lot of his time working with new and existing businesses to ensure that Tyngsborough is a welcoming place where everyone's business can succeed.

This fall, we also completed our Town Center Pedestrian Project. The project took a severely overgrown and underutilized space and turned it into a vibrant gathering space that is completed accessible. The project was funded by a state-grant and some CPC matching funds.

In October the Town released an Invitations to Bid for the construction of a new pre-engineered steel building that will house the DPW on the same site as the current DPW building on Kendall Road. This building will have five garage bays and room for office space build out in a future phase. The construction of the building is funded through ARPA funds allocated as a part of the FY24 capital process and a proportional matching share from the Sewer Enterprise Fund.

Finally, Town Meeting convened on October 22, 2024 and considered 8 warrant articles. You can learn about Town Meeting and find the Town Meeting results by visiting www.tyngsboroughma.gov

Textiles: In any condition - Clothing and fashion accessories, underclothes, coats, footwear, purses, wallets, backpacks, towels, all linens, curtains, throw rugs, stuffed animals.

Mercury-containing items - Fluorescent and CFL bulbs, thermometers, rechargeable batteries, elemental mercury.

TYNGSBOROUGH'S YARD WASTE DROP-OFF SITE

The Residential Yard Waste Drop Off Site is located across the street from Town Hall, 25 Bryants Lane, closer to the Middlesex Road end. Use of this Yard Waste Drop-Off Site is available to residents only, is free and usage is unlimited during operating hours. Vehicles will enter & exit through the same driveway. Look for the signage on Bryants Lane. Open Tuesday through Friday 7:30 AM - 3:30 PM, Saturday 8:30 AM - 3:30 PM. Please note that the Town will close the site during heavy rain events or snow events. Notices about changes of hours due to weather events will be posted on the Town website & social media.

Yard waste may be dumped from any type of container **or left in paper leaf bags**. No items should be left in anything other than paper bags. If transporting the yard waste via plastic bag or barrel, please dump directly onto the ground. Signs will point you to where to leave the yard waste. Your cooperation in keeping the site orderly is appreciated.

MEDICARE OPEN ENROLLMENT By Edward H. Adamsky

Medicare open enrollment is here. From October 15 through December 7, you can make any changes you want to your coverage. Those changes will take effect on the first of next year. There are new laws governing health insurance, so you should investigate carefully to see if you want to make any changes.

You can switch between Medicare Advantage plans. Or if you are in an Advantage plan and don't like it, you can switch back to traditional Medicare. If you are in traditional Medicare you can move to an Advantage Plan, or if you are staying with traditional Medicare, you can switch your Part D (prescription) plan. If you are in an Advantage plan now, you also have an additional period of January 1 to March 31 of next year when you can switch or drop your plan. With the new laws some Advantage plans are changing significantly, or may even be dropped, so you may have to make a change.

Be sure to contact your doctors to make sure they take your plan and if you are going to change, make sure they take the one you are planning to go to. Many Advantage plans have no premium which can seem tempting (along with the extra benefits they provide) but you may want to review all of the plans carefully, even if they have a premium, to see what is best for you.

The Inflation Reduction Act may mean that you will see lower prices for your prescription drugs in the coming years. But this might mean that some Part D plans will increase their premiums. The Government plans to take steps to stop this and has capped the price increase that carriers can charge to \$35 for next year. Still, this may mean changes in the future, so your plan might go away or change. Keep an eye out for any mailings from your insurance company.

You will have a yearly cap on prescription drugs of \$2000 for 2025, so that should reduce costs for some people. Those with fairly expensive prescriptions now may find that they will save a lot next year. Those on insulin will find their costs capped at \$35 per month. (That cap doesn't include some related items). Again, check the plan options and compare their drug formulary (the ones they cover) to make sure your prescriptions are covered by the plan you choose.

There is a program called Extra Help that can pay for some of your premiums if you qualify. It is a low-income program, but the limit has been increased to 150 percent of the Federal Poverty Level. Look into the program and apply if you are eligible.

Contact your insurance broker, if you use one, your Elder Law Attorney, or go online to Medicare.gov to find many handouts and informational articles about open enrollment and choosing a health insurance plan for next year. And do it now!



LOVE IS KIND by Kurt Paquette

Paul devotes many words to the subject of love because he wants to show the Corinthians "a more excellent way. He describes how love behaves 1 Corinthians 13..

Among love's many fruits is the sweet balm of kindness. "Love is kind," says Paul. Kindness is defined by Merriam—Webster's Dictionary as "of a sympathetic or helpful nature." Kindness is easily recognized and speedily praised by all, for it's a quality that people intuitively understand because it projects the love and compassion, we feel toward ourselves.

Jesus expressed it this way, "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you; for this is the law and the prophets" (Matt.7:12 NRSV). In other words, treat people the way you want to be treated. Ask yourself, "How do I like to be treated by other people?"

Now that you can answer those questions for yourself, flip it around and consider them from the other person's perspective. How should you treat someone in these situations? That's kindness – treating others the way you want to be treated. Some more thoughts on kindness:

Kindness is sympathetic. A kind person seeks to help people who are in distress, struggling, or need assistance. It can be a simple act like holding the door for an elderly lady or lending a few dollars to a friend in a pinch. To be kind sometimes requires that a person be more involved or devote more time to a person's situation. Kindness is impartial. It does not play favorites, nor does it respect people according to worldly standards. It is not prejudiced but seeks the welfare of everyone. "Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all, especially to those who are of the household of faith," (Gal.6:10 NKJV). Part of being kind is relating to people different from you, putting yourself in that person's shoes, trying to imagine what they're feeling, and extending comfort and support. Kindness is merciful. One of the greatest acts of kindness is to forgive someone for some offense or transgression. The Hebrew word *hesed* (mercy) is translated as loving kindness by the NKJV; loving kindness is what mercy is all about. David says the man whose sins are covered is blessed (Psalm 32:1). We should not feel put upon to forgive someone who sinned against us, but rather rejoice that we can bless some penitent soul, forgiving them as God has forgiven us! What greater kindness is there?



REDUCE • REUSE • RECYCLE SUSTAINABLE TYNGSBOROUGH

There is significance to the order of words in the slogan "Reduce, Reuse, Recycle." Recycling is good, but reusing is even more impactful than recycling, and reducing is the most impactful of the three.

Massachusetts residents, businesses and municipalities produce 6 million tons of waste per year (trash+recycling). We have run out of room for our waste and have become a waste export state. Material reuse is essential to reducing waste.

The Sustainability Committee has set a goal of 3% reduction in Tyngsborough's total waste tonnage. Last fiscal year we brought 3,959 tons (trash+recycling) to the curb. Can we reduce this total by 119 tons (238,000 pounds)? The Sustainability Committee provides and suggests the following ways you can help, in order of their impact

- Don't trash your food waste! Turn it into rich compost with a backyard compost bin (no meats) or by bringing all food scraps to the Recycling Center at the DPW (Kendall Road).
- Remember that textiles are banned from the trash. Bring your clothing, other textiles and shoes to one of our collection bins at the Recycling Center (DPW) or next to the Tyngsborough Middle School or have Helpsy come and collect them curbside (Schedule a pickup at https://www.helpsy.co/pickup).
- Consider buying something you need at a second-hand store or reselling or giving away unwanted items in good condition.
- Say NO to single-use bottles, bags and food utensils & containers: Replace disposable water bottles with reusable ones; bring your own bags to the grocery store; bring your refillable coffee mug to the coffee shop; reuse plastic storage bags and aluminum foil (wash, air dry after each use) or purchase silicone-based reusable storage bags; reuse glass jars for food storage (food storage in glass is better for your health than storing in plastic).
- When choosing between products, consider their packaging.
 Which one results in less waste? Check www.recyclesmartMA.org
 to determine if your packaging is recyclable or just trash.

- Choose stores that offer bulk or refill products, where you can bring your own refillable containers. Find a merchant near you at https://www.unpackedliving.com/blogs/news/zero-waste-massachusetts-directory.
- Request to join the Facebook Group called" Buy Nothing -Tyngsboro, MA," where residents give and ask for all sorts of items for free.
- Own a business? Consider implementing reuse where possible (https://upstreamsolutions.org/reuse-businesses-directory).

Don't be overwhelmed by this list. Choose a few new habits that are doable for you. If you're already doing some of these things, are there new ideas you might try? Every little bit adds up.

Let's explore some of the factors behind why we see higher amounts of water heater failures as outside temperatures drop.

Water coming into and exiting the water heater will be affected by the external temperatures, causing the heater to work harder during colder months. Location matters. Often installed in colder areas, such as unfinished basements or a garage, means the unit needs to work overtime to raise and maintain water temperatures.

Age of the unit. Older tanks with large amounts of sediment build-up and corroded anode rods are more likely to fail under heavier stress. Finally, hot water demands go up when it's cold outside. We use more and hotter water for things like showers, baths and dishes when it's chilly outside.

Annual check-ups by a professional plumber can help avoid unexpected breakdowns.

Take advantage of open enrollment

If you work for a midsize or large company, you may soon be able to review your employee benefits package, as we are entering the open enrollment season. So, consider your options carefully, with an eye toward making changes appropriate for your needs.

Here are some of the key areas to look at:

- Retirement plan Depending on your employer, you could change your 401(k) or similar retirement plan at any time of the year, but you might want to use the open enrollment season to review your contribution amounts. If your salary has gone up over the past year, you might want to boost your pre-tax contributions (including catch-up contributions beginning at age 50). At a minimum, try to put in at least enough to earn your employer's match, if one is offered. At the same time, look over how your contributions are allocated among the various investment options in your plan. You'll want your investment mix to reflect your goals, risk tolerance and time horizon.
- Life insurance If your employer offers group life insurance at no cost as an employee benefit, you may want to take it but be aware that it might not be enough to fully protect your family should anything happen to you. You may have heard that you need about seven to 10 times your annual income as a life insurance death benefit, but there's really no one right answer for everyone. Instead, you should evaluate various factors including your mortgage, your income, your spouse's income (if applicable), your liabilities, the number of years until your retirement, number of children and their future educational needs to determine how much insurance you need. If your employer's group policy seems insufficient, you may want to consider adding some outside overage.
- Disability insurance Your employer may offer no-cost group disability insurance, but as is the case with life insurance, it might not be sufficient to adequately protect your income in case you become temporarily or permanently disabled. In fact, many employer-sponsored disability plans only cover a short period, such as five years, so to gain longer coverage up to age 65, you may want to look for a separate personal policy. Disability policies vary widely in premium costs and benefits, so you'll want to do some comparison shopping with several insurance companies.
- Flexible spending account A flexible spending account (FSA) lets you contribute up to \$3,200 pre-tax dollars to pay for some out-of-pocket medical costs, such as prescriptions and insurance copayments and deductibles. You decide how much you want to put into your FSA, up to the 2025 limit. You generally must use up the funds in your FSA by the end of the calendar year, but your employer may grant you an extension of 2½ months or allow you to carry over up to \$640.
- Health savings account Like an FSA, a health savings account (HSA) lets you use pre-tax dollars to pay out-of-pocket medical costs. Unlike an FSA, though, your unused HSA contributions will carry over to the next year. Also, an HSA allows you take withdrawals, though they may be assessed a 10% penalty. To contribute to an HSA, you need to participate in a high-deductible health insurance plan.

Make the most of your benefits package — it can be a big part of your overall financial picture.

SHARING FILES FROM YOUR WINDOWS PC TO YOUR CELL PHONE

Have you ever been out of the house and wishing that you had access to a file or picture stored on your Windows PC at home? This feature is available now. Microsoft has the OneDrive App for both Android AND Apple iPhone to give you instant access to files on that home PC. You can open a document using your phone, and even edit it. 
